

I hope you will read all 99 because each little thought has some valuable insights into what makes us tick. But I thought it might be a good idea to start out by listing

some fundamental guy stuff. Some really basic, but really important stuff about guys that will help you out even if you don't read anything else in this book — which would be a MASSIVE mistake because the smart girl wants to know as much about guys as she possibly can!

1. Guys are way different than you.

Kind of obvious, I know. But when I say we are way different I mean WAY different! The truth is that most of the differences are a really good thing and part of how God designed us. It's important to understand and appreciate this fact, because while there are some things we can change or learn to control about ourselves, there is a whole bunch of stuff that can't be changed at all — it's stuff that can only be understood and appreciated.

The bad part about it is that our competitive nature tends to leak into other areas of our lives that aren't always as harmless. Lots of friendships between guys and other guys and between guys and girls have been messed up because we don't always know how to turn off the competition button. We play games with girls, too. Sorry.

3. Guys like to be the hero.

It may be because we read too many comic books or watch too many action movies, but when we see stuff that doesn't seem fair we like to swoop in and try to save the day. Usually nothing really needs to be saved and we just end up looking dorky. But hey, at least we tried, right?

4. Guys want to feel important.

I don't mean important like the president of the United States is important, or even like the principal at your school is important. I just mean that something in the way guys are wired makes us want to feel needed and helpful — especially to the ladies.

5. Guys tend to see things in "black and white" not "gray."

We usually just see one side of an issue, we think problems should have simple solutions, we tend to see things as "right" or "wrong," and we have a harder time with things like compromise than you girls typically do. Because of this, we have a tendency to jump to conclusions pretty quickly.

6. The world is **kinda confusing** to most guys.

Are we supposed to be rough and tough or gentle and sensitive? Are we supposed to pay for the date or let girls pay their own way? What makes a real man these days? The world we live in has changed a lot and most guys (especially younger ones) are trying to figure out how exactly a guy is supposed to act manly while wearing skinny jeans.

7. Guys really, really care what their friends think of them.

Girls do, too, but for guys it's different. We will do or say almost anything if we think it will get the approval of our friends, or make them laugh. Unfortunately, this means that sometimes guys will treat girls really poorly if it helps them save face with their friends.

8. Guys like to brag.

Because we care what our friends think, we brag, exaggerate, and sometimes even make things up that aren't true. And sometimes we make stuff up about girls. Sorry.

9. Guys don't understand you.

Seriously, we are way too simpleminded to understand the complexities of females. You confuse us. Think of us as cavemen wearing jeans and a T-shirt.



10. Guys are bad listeners.

The sooner you understand this, the better. It's not because we don't care, it's just because we don't care enough to listen well. Unless your story includes explosions, car chases, or sports, we lose interest quickly. I heard once about this ONE guy in a small town in the Midwest who is working at being a better listener — but I forget the details, I really wasn't listening.

Girls, I know this is extremely difficult for us at times. We have a lot to say and we want someone to listen. And sometimes we really want our guy friends to be the comforter and listener when things get crazy for us. However, we can't expect our guy friends to be the same kind of listeners as our girl friends. They are not the same as your girl friends. As girls we can sit and listen to each other's drama for hours at a time. Guys can't do that - and we can't expect them to. Adjust your expectations of guys in the area of listening. When something crazy happens in your day, talk to your girl friends first - give them the long version. Then go to your guy friends and give them the three-minute version. I really believe that guys want to know what is going on with us - but they just want it packaged in a really short and to-the-point version.
