Denise had to admit: She hadn't.


That leader scuttled the rest of her lesson and gathered the rest of the group around Denise.

Build in time for relationships to flourish—with Jesus, with you, and with one another.

Always be moving toward friendship. That's where the good stuff is.

Because once the people you're teaching love Jesus, you won't have to convince them to live in a way that pleases Jesus. They'll naturally go straight there because that's how they'll please their friend.
