What I learned today:

Bible Time: Jeremiah 33:14-16

Long before Jesus was born, God gave a message to the prophet Jeremiah. God promised to send Jesus to save his people. Jeremiah told people that God planned to keep his promise. Someday a baby would be born as a member of King David's family line. This baby would grow up to save God's people. Jesus was born, just as God promised. And Jesus was a member of King David's family line. Jesus fulfilled God's promise because he grew up to save people from their sins. In the New Testament, Matthew wrote that Jesus kept the promise God made through the prophet.

Key Verse: "All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel'—which means 'God with us'" (Matthew 1:22-23).

Bible Point: Jesus fulfilled God's promise.



Weather Predictions Watch the weather forecast together for a few weeks. Keep track of how many times the forecast is correct or incorrect. Talk about methods meteorologists use to determine the weather forecast. With all of their technology, meteorologists still get the forecast wrong on occasion. No person can predict the future—only God knows the future. When God says something will happen, it always does. As a family, praise God for keeping his promises—and for controlling the weather!

Promise Pals This week, see how many promises your family members can make and keep. Every morning at breakfast, let each person make a promise to someone else in the family. For example, someone might promise to clear the table without being asked or to read a book at bedtime. Then see how many promises are kept. At the end of the week, talk about how hard it is sometimes to keep our promises. Then celebrate the fact that God *always* keeps his promises!

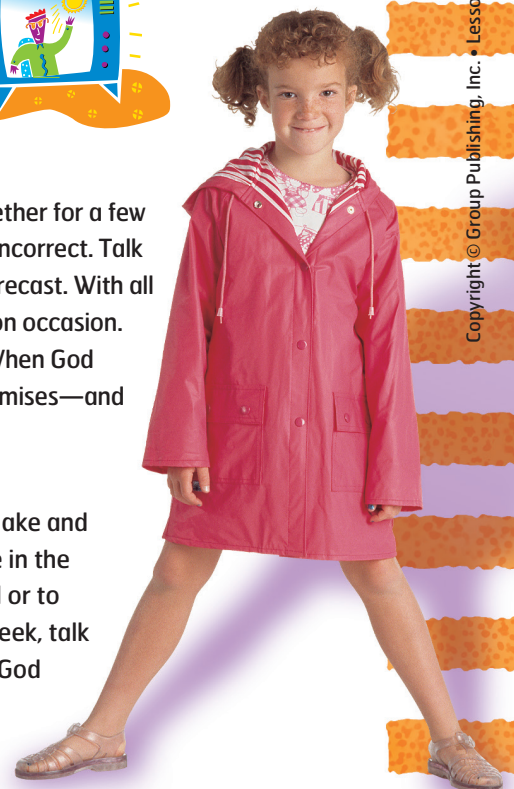

WEEK 5	Jesus Grows Up (Luke 2:39-52)	"I and the Father are one" (John 10:30).	Jesus is special.
WEEK 6	The Word Became Flesh (John 1:1-18)	"Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).	We can be God's children.
WEEK 7	Satan Tempts Jesus (Luke 4:1-13)	"Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted" (Hebrews 2:18).	Jesus helps us resist temptation.
WEEK 8	Jesus Performs His First Miracle (John 2:1-11)	"But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31).	Jesus can do miracles.
WEEK 9	Jesus Teaches in a Synagogue (Luke 4:14-21)	"For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost" (Luke 19:10).	Jesus came for all people.
WEEK 10	Jesus Is Rejected in His Hometown (Luke 4:22-30)	"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5).	Believe in Jesus.
WEEK 11	Moses and Elijah Appear With Jesus (Luke 9:28-36)	"We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).	Jesus is God's Son.
WEEK 12	Jesus Teaches About Rewards (Luke 6:17-26)	"Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things" (Colossians 3:2).	Jesus blesses people who have faith.
