## What I learned today:

### Bible Story: Luke 6:43-45

People will know you are a Christian only if you act like a Christian. Jesus talked about how a good tree doesn't have bad fruit and a bad tree doesn't have good fruit. He also said that you couldn't find figs on thornbushes or grapes on briars. In other words, you won't find oranges on an apple tree! God wants us to be like Jesus on the inside so that people will see Jesus on the outside!

**Key Verse:** "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

**Bible Point:** Acting like Jesus shows we're Christians.

**Fruit Fest** As a family, go through gardening books or magazines and find out about all different kinds of fruit—where they grow and what kind of trees or

bushes they grow on. Then, try to find bare fruit trees and guess what kind of fruit grows on them. Then talk as a family about what kind of fruit you produce as Christians. Do you invite friends to church or Sunday school? Do you tell other people about Jesus? How can you produce better fruit and let others know you're Christians?

**Family Fruit Salad** Have everyone put his or her favorite fruit into a family fruit salad. Serve a bowl of the fruit salad with some whipped cream one night after dinner. As a family, talk with each other about what kind of "fruit" God wants to see in your lives.

## Daily Challenges

Today kids committed to one of the following Daily Challenges. Help your child weave

faith into life this week and follow through on his or her challenge! (Have kids circle their choice below.)

- Tell someone at school about Jesus.
- When your dad or mom comes home from work, give him or her a big hug, and thank him or her for being a great parent!
- Help your neighbor around the house. Offer to clean, help with yardwork, or whatever else they may need!

WEEK 6	Apostles Defend Their Faith (Acts 5:12-42)	"Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance" (James 1:2-3).	Keep following God, even when it's hard.
WEEK 7	Saul Meets Jesus Near Damascus (Acts 9:1-20)	"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17).	Jesus changes our lives.
WEEK 8	Peter Raises Tabitha From the Dead (Acts 9:36-43)	"The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective" (James 5:16).	God answers when we pray.
WEEK 9	An Angel Frees Peter From Jail (Acts 12:1-18)	"For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways" (Psalm 91:11).	Angels protect and help God's people.
WEEK 10	Lydia Is Converted (Acts 16:9-15)	"Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season" (2 Timothy 4:2).	Be prepared to tell others about Jesus.
WEEK 11	Paul's Jailer Believes in Jesus (Acts 16:16-34)	"They replied, 'Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved'" (Acts 16:31).	Jesus saves us.
WEEK 12	Paul Describes Living by God's Spirit (Romans 8:9-17)	"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23).	When we live by God's Spirit, God changes us.
WEEK 13	Paul Describes Genuine Love (1 Corinthians 13:1-13)	"Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs" (1 Corinthians 13:4-5).	God teaches us how to love.
