Showing Love

BIBLE FOCUS (THE BASICS)

God cares for each of us, whether we're rich or poor, because he loves us. God uses people who love him to care for his children. In today's Bible passage, a widow was being hounded by bill collectors trying to collect money the widow didn't have. All the widow had was a few drops of oil. In desperation, the widow went to Elisha to ask for help. Elisha told the widow and her sons to go to all of her neighbors and ask for empty jars. After they'd collected the jars, the widow was to take her little bit of oil and begin pouring it into the empty jars. And so she did.

The widow began pouring the oil into the jars as her sons gave them to her. She kept filling and filling and filling, until they ran out of jars. Then the oil stopped flowing. The widow sold all the jars of oil to pay her bills. And she and her two sons lived on the money that was left.

Bible Point: God cares for needy people.

Key Verse: "He [God] defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the alien, giving him food and clothing" (Deuteronomy 10:18).

WEEK 7	Daniel's Friends Are Safe in the Fiery Furnace (Daniel 3)	"Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be men of courage; be strong" (1 Corinthians 16:13).	Stand strong for God.
WEEK 8	God Protects Daniel in the Lions' Den (Daniel 6:1-23)	"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7).	God protects us.
