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
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BIBLE FOCUS (THE BASICS)

God made a big promise. He said a special day would come, and on this special day, he would send a special person, a relative of King David, to lead the people. This person would do what was right and just and fair. This person would save God's people. They would live in safety. Although God made this promise a long time ago, he kept his promise on the special day Jesus was born. Jesus would be the one to save the people. Jesus would be "God with us."

Bible Point: Jesus fulfilled God's promise.

Key Verse: "All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him 'Immanuel'—which means, 'God with us' " (Matthew 1:22-23).



Choose a way you'll remember to keep your promises this week just as God kept his promise by sending Jesus:

- Get some paper and writing supplies. Pray about the way you honor your promises. As you pray, creatively express your promisekeeping through creative writing. When you're done, pray and ask God to help you keep your promises.
- Draw small pictures to depict the different ways God has kept promises to you or other people you know. Combine those drawings into a collage so you can stand back and admire the promises God's kept. Hang your collage in a prominent place in your room, and remember to thank God for keeping his promises when you see it.
- Put your promise card in a place you won't forget it. When you get home, talk to someone in your family about it. Give your card to the person you wrote it to, and ask God to help you as you follow through on this promise.

Keep Your Promises




Gather condensed milk, food coloring, white bread, new paintbrushes, bowls, and a toaster. Set out four small bowls. Pour into each bowl one tablespoon of condensed milk. Drop a few drops of food coloring into the bowls to make the colors of your choice. Mix well.

As a family talk about the importance of keeping promises. Discuss the importance of trusting God to keep his promises. Then, with a new paintbrush, use the colored milk as your "paint," and paint pictures or designs on your bread that represent how God keeps his promises. For example, you might paint a heart, a cross, or a rainbow. To reveal your design, lightly toast your bread in the toaster. Say a "toast" to God, and thank him for fulfilling his biggest promise through Jesus, and then enjoy your snacks together.

WEEK 6	The Word Became Flesh (John 1:1-18)	"Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).	We can be God's children.
WEEK 7	Satan Tempts Jesus (Luke 4:1-13)	"Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted" (Hebrews 2:18).	Jesus helps us resist temptation.
WEEK 8	Jesus Performs His First Miracle (John 2:1-11)	"But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31).	Jesus can do miracles.
WEEK 9	Jesus Teaches in a Synagogue (Luke 4:14-21)	"For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost" (Luke 19:10).	Jesus came for all people.
WEEK 10	Jesus Is Rejected in His Hometown (Luke 4:22-30)	"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5).	Believe in Jesus.
WEEK 11	Moses and Elijah Appear With Jesus (Luke 9:28-36)	"The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).	Jesus is God's Son.
