



# In the Bible

David wrote most of the book of Psalms. But not everyone knows that Solomon also wrote some of Psalms. Psalm 72 is one Solomon probably wrote. The psalm describes a man who would come along after Solomon and do many great things. You might think Solomon was writing this psalm about his son; however, his son didn't do the things described. But you can probably guess who did—Jesus! Many Bible experts believe this psalm was actually written about Jesus, who hadn't been born yet. Today's Key Verse reminds us of what Jesus does for us as the mediator between God and us. And in response, we can worship him! (Psalm 72:1-19)

- What great things does Jesus do for us?
- What's so important about what Jesus does?
- How can we respond to what Jesus does for us?

## Daily Challenge

Express your faith in worship to God this week:

- Set aside time this week to reflect upon the great things Jesus is doing in your life. Commit to making it the first thing you think about in the morning and the last thing you think about at night.
- Make some time each day to simply talk to Jesus. Ask him for the things that are on your heart, and ask Jesus to help you see the great things he has planned for your life.
- Come up with a way you can give Jesus thanks for his love for you.
   Journal, write a poem, talk to yourself—whatever you want—just
   reflect for an hour or so on Jesus' love for you. Then take time to
   thank him for his incredible love.



WEEK 5	Joseph Takes His Family to Safety in Egypt (Matthew 2:13- 23)	"The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in him" (Nahum 1:7).	God guides us.
WEEK 6	Jesus Is Baptized (Matthew 3:13-17)	"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1).	Jesus is God's Son.
WEEK 7	Peter and Andrew Meet Jesus (John 1:35-42)	"Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).	Jesus is our friend.
WEEK 8	News About Jesus Spreads (Matthew 4:12-25)	"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).	Jesus wants everyone to follow him.
WEEK 9	Jesus Gives the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12)	"Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things" (Philippians 4:8).	God blesses us when we choose his ways.
WEEK 10	Jesus Teaches That We Are to Be Salt and Light (Matthew 5:13-16)	"In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).	Help others see Jesus.
WEEK 11	Jesus Walks on Water (Matthew 14:22-33)	"If we are faithless, he will remain faithful, for he cannot disown himself" (2 Timothy 2:13).	Jesus helps us believe.
WEEK 12	Zacchaeus Climbs a Tree to See Jesus (Luke 19:1-10)	"Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me" (Revelation 3:20).	Jesus accepts everyone.
WEEK 13	Jesus Blesses the Children (Mark 10:13-16)	"Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these" (Mark 10:14).	Everyone is important to Jesus.
