Experiential


What we experience through action and discussion sticks with us up to 9 times longer than what we simply hear or read.

Research shows that the most powerful influence on children's faith development is the conversation about faith that takes place in the home. We want to partner with you in your child's Christian education.



Key Verse: "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile" (Romans 1:16).

Jesus was speaking plainly about his coming suffering and crucifixion, as well as his rising from the dead. The Apostle Peter took Jesus aside and criticized him for talking in such a way.

Jesus quickly made it clear that nothing—and NOBODY—would interfere with his following God and doing what he had come to earth to do. And Jesus made it clear that to follow him, his disciples must have the same single-minded purpose.

- Treat a family member or friend with love when it's difficult to love that person.
- Do you have a friend who doesn't believe in Jesus? Talk to that friend about what you believe, and stand up for Jesus.
- Make a plan to give something up, such as playing video games or watching a TV show, to spend more time with Jesus.

Fumbler!

Blindfold one member of the family, and crown that person "Family Fumbler" for this activity.

Ask that person to lead you to another room on the far side of your home.

Everyone in line has to do what the Family Fumbler does. When you reach your destination, discuss

these questions as a family:

- What obstacles did the Family Fumbler encounter?
- How is following a blindfolded person through the house like following someone who doesn't know Jesus?

Finish up with a rousing game
of Follow the Leader. Take turns
leading, with the youngest
person going first and the oldest
person going last.

WEEK 5	People Rejoice as Jesus Enters Jerusalem (Mark 11:1-11)	"That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:10-11).	Jesus is our king.
WEEK 6	Jesus Is Alive! (Mark 16:1-8)	"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies'" (John 11:25).	Jesus is alive.
WEEK 7	Jesus Appears to His Disciples (John 20:19-31)	"Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see" (Hebrews 11:1).	Believe in Jesus.
WEEK 8	Paul Teaches About Spiritual Gifts (1 Corinthians 12:4-27)	"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10).	God gives us gifts to serve him.
WEEK 9	Peter Tells the Sanhedrin About Jesus (Acts 4:5-14)	"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9).	Trusting God makes us brave.
WEEK 10	Philip Tells the Ethiopian About Jesus (Acts 8:26-40)	"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:5-6).	Follow where God leads.
WEEK 11	Peter Visits Cornelius (Acts 10:1-44)	"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20).	Tell everyone about Jesus.
WEEK 12	Barnabas Encourages Christians in Antioch (Acts 11:19-26)	"But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called Today, so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness" (Hebrews 3:13).	Encourage each other to believe in Jesus.
WEEK 13	Jesus Sends Power From God (Acts 2:1-21)	"But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you" (John 14:26).	God gives us the Holy Spirit.
