

places, books and other possessions, and the kinds of events you have scheduled on you family calendar. Talk about how important God is in your family life. Then discuss how you might work as a family to make God even more important to you.

Jesus chose to use a tree/fruit metaphor to explain an important spiritual concept. Jesus told his listeners that people are like trees: They all bear fruit, either good or bad. So how can you tell the difference between a good tree and a bad tree? Good trees give good fruit, and bad trees produce bad fruit. People are the same way. You can tell what's in people's hearts by how they behave. Like fruit, our actions show who we really are. People whose lives are being changed by Jesus will show it in the way they act. (Luke 6:43-45)

WEEK 6	Apostles Defend Their Faith (Acts 5:12-42)	"Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance" (James 1:2-3).	Keep following God, even when it's hard.
WEEK 7	Saul Meets Jesus Near Damascus (Acts 9:1-20)	"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17).	Jesus changes our lives.
WEEK 8	Peter Raises Tabitha From the Dead (Acts 9:36-43)	"The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective" (James 5:16).	God answers when we pray.
