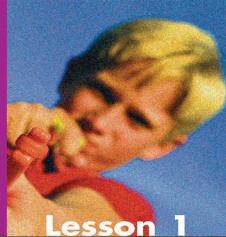
MY

LORD'S PRAYER



Key Verse: "This, then, is how you should pray: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one' " (Matthew 6:9-13).





Imagine the power and drama of hearing Jesus share the very words he used to communicate with his Father, the Almighty God! His disciples had been given the secret key to knowing God more fully. In this passage, Jesus shared his own "tools for prayer." He wanted his disciples to use these tools to help them grow in their relationship with God. (Matthew 6:5-13)

- ✓ What were some of the tools Jesus told the disciples to use as they prayed?
- ✓ Why do you think Jesus' advice about prayer is important?

## Family Fun

**A**s a family, gather around a table and open Bibles to the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13) or refer to the Key Verse on the other side of this page. You'll also need a few copies of recent newspapers or access to news stories on the Internet. Let family members look for news stories that are examples of each phrase of the Lord's Prayer. For example, for the phrase "Give us today our daily bread," a family member might point out a news story about unemployment and another might choose a news story about the needs at a local food bank. After you've gone through all the phrases of the Lord's Prayer with news stories, pray as a family for all of the needs you found.

### Daily Challenge

Focus on your prayer life this week:

- Pray the Lord's Prayer with your family. After each phrase, pause and let family members share something the phrase means to them personally.
- This week when you pray, instead of asking God what he can do for you, ask God to guide you in doing his will. Then look for ways to actively be the hands and feet of Jesus to someone this week.
- Think of something you've prayed for recently. How did God respond in a way that you didn't expect? Thank God for answering your prayers according to his will.
