



Choose a way you'll please God with your obedience this week.

- The next time your parents ask you to do something, obey them without hesitating or arguing.
- One way God wants us to obey is by loving a neighbor. Ask an elderly friend or neighbor what he or she needs help with. Within reason, do whatever the person mentions.
- God's greatest commandment is to love God. One way we do that is by spending time with God. Choose a time to meet with God without any interruptions or distractions.

In Genesis 22:1-18, God promised Abraham he would have a son—and sure enough, when Abraham was 90, Isaac was born. So what's up with God asking ol' Abe to SACRIFICE this promised son a few years later? The Bible DOES say this was a test—but WHAT a test! But Abraham loved God—and he'd do anything to please God, especially obey him. It's interesting to note that the Bible doesn't say anything about Abraham's concern about sacrificing his son. Was it because he knew what God had in mind? Was it because he was REALLY willing to sacrifice his son at God's request? Whatever Abraham's thinking, he was willing to do what God asked. Abraham knew that obedience isn't tied to emotion or situation. He showed us that when God asks, we're REQUIRED to obey. Period.

- · What do you honestly think of Abraham's response?
- When has it been difficult for you to obey God? What did you do?
- How does Abraham's situation encourage you to obey God?

Family Fun

Put a blank sheet of paper on your refrigerator. At the top of the page write "Ways to Obey." Throughout the week, encourage family members to write ideas they have about how they can obey what God asks. At the end of the week, read through the list. Then have family members share times this week that they obeyed God.

WEEK 5	Joseph Dreams Disturbing Dreams (Genesis 37:1-11)	"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (John 13:34).	Show Jesus' love in our families.
WEEK 6	Joseph's Brothers Sell Him Into Slavery (Genesis 37:12-36)	"Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth" (1 John 3:18).	God wants us to do what's right.
WEEK 7	Pharaoh Puts Joseph in Charge (Genesis 39:20-41:49)	"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23).	We can serve God anywhere.
WEEK 8	Joseph Forgives His Brothers (Genesis 42–45)	"Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you" (Colossians 3:13).	God wants us to forgive.
WEEK 9	God Protects Moses (Exodus 1:1-2:10)	"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1).	God protects us.
WEEK 10	Moses Meets God at the Burning Bush (Exodus 2:11–3:20)	"I can do everything through him who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13).	God can use us.
WEEK 11	The Israelites Receive Cruel Treatment (Exodus 5:1-6:1)	"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint" (Isaiah 40:31).	God wants us to hope in him.
WEEK 12	God Sends Plagues on Egypt (Exodus 7:8–10:29)	"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10).	God uses his power to help us.
WEEK 13	The Israelites Escape From Egypt (Exodus 11:1–12:36)	"So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36).	Jesus sets us free.
