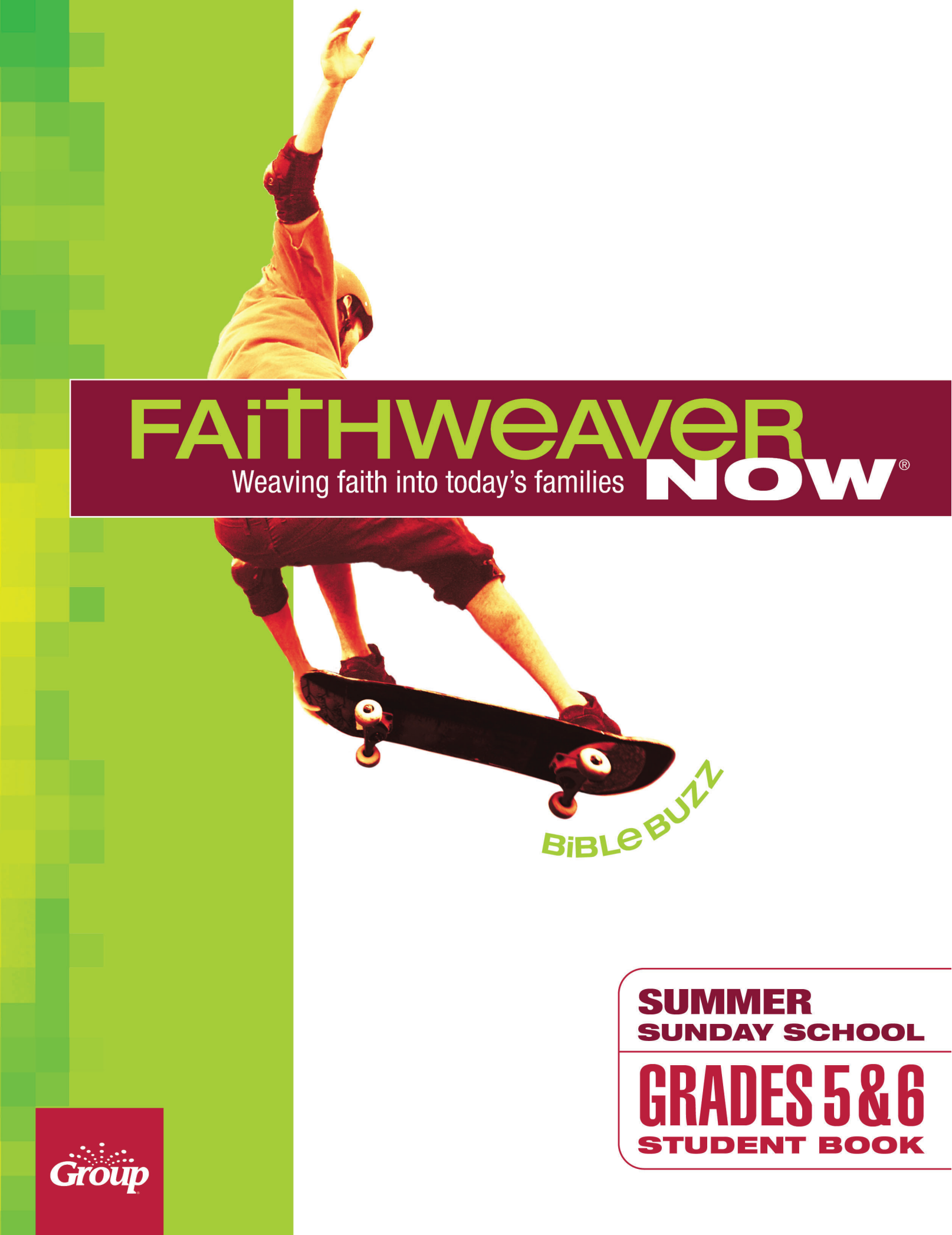

Butterfly

They called me "Butterfly." I am 20 years old, and I have had leprosy since I was 12. The people in my small village in Nepal wouldn't look at me or speak to me; they believed that my horrible disease was caused because I did bad things in my life. I thought this, too. Then I met Joe at a missionary clinic. When I first went to the clinic, I was so afraid that I wouldn't even talk to anyone. But Joe kept trying, and finally I shared my story with him and let him examine me. He told me that God loves me, and he gave me medicine to help me get better. He found me a home with a Christian couple who showed me the way to Jesus.

Jack

My name is Jack. I was born with a disability and need to use a wheelchair to get around. I need people to help me do just about everything. My parents don't have a lot of money, and my medical expenses are really high. About a year ago, I had grown out of my wheelchair. I hardly fit into it and my feet were dragging on the ground. But a new one cost more than \$1,000 and my parents just didn't have the money. We decided to pray together and ask God to help us. About a week later, there was an envelope in the mailbox. It had no return address. We opened it, and out fell a check for exactly \$1,000! God took care of me!

Paola

My name is Paola. I am 8 years old, and I live in an orphanage in Honduras. I came to the orphanage two years ago. My mom and dad died when I was very small, and I lived on the streets with my brothers and sisters. We were always scared; people tried to hurt us, and we never had enough to eat. I wanted so much to have a home. One day, a man named Dennis came walking down the street we had been sleeping on. We all ran and hid because we thought he would want to hurt us. But he just sat down and began to sing a song about Jesus. We came out slowly and sat around him. He told us about his home and told us that it could be our home, too, if we wanted to go. My brothers and sisters and I have lived here ever since. We have enough food to eat, beds to sleep on, and clothes to wear. And I get to go to school every day!

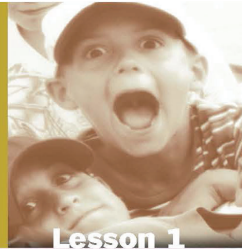
Tina

Hi, I'm Tina. I'm 14, and I have a son who just turned 1. When my parents found out I was pregnant, they got really mad at me and kicked me out of the house. I didn't know what to do. I stayed at friends' houses, but I knew they didn't really want me there. I felt really scared and sad. I went to church one Sunday, and a lady stood up in class and started talking about a new pregnancy center she was opening for women in "crisis pregnancies." I figured I was in a crisis, so I got up the nerve and talked to her after church. She gave me a big hug and then took me home with her. My son and I still live here; I'm finishing school, and I'm handling life better.

PRAYER

Key Verse: "He [God] defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the alien, giving him food and clothing" (Deuteronomy 10:18).



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God provides extravagant care for his children, a fact that is clearly demonstrated in the account of Elisha and the widow. The widow found herself in a desperate, frightening situation—her husband had died, leaving her and their two sons with no means to provide for themselves or pay off their debts. She called out to the prophet Elisha for help. Elisha told the widow to do something strange: borrow all the jars she could from her neighbors. Miraculously, the little bit of oil the widow had in her home was enough to fill all the jars, which she could then sell to pay her debts! God always provides. (2 Kings 4:1-7)

Family Fun



Work with your family to create an "Extravagant Care" kit. Include nonperishable food items, such as bottles of juice, crackers, and fruit in snack packs, as well as a roll of quarters, a washcloth and a bar of soap, and a small Bible. Put the kit into a paper bag and include a note that says "God loves you!" Keep the kit in your car. The next time you see someone asking for food or money, give that person the care kit with a smile. As you work together, discuss God's amazing care for each of his children.

WEEK 7	Daniel's Friends Are Safe in the Fiery Furnace (Daniel 3)	"Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be men of courage; be strong" (1 Corinthians 16:13).	Stand strong for God.
WEEK 8	God Protects Daniel in the Lions' Den (Daniel 6:1-23)	"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7).	God protects us.
WEEK 9	God Promises to Restore Israel After the Exile (Jeremiah 29:4-14)	"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).	We seek God no matter what happens.
WEEK 10	Nehemiah Seeks God's Forgiveness for Israel (Nehemiah 1:1-2:9)	"If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land" (2 Chronicles 7:14).	We seek God's forgiveness.
WEEK 11	Nehemiah Rebuilds the Wall (Nehemiah 2:11-6:19)	"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23).	God helps us face challenges.
WEEK 12	Esther Saves Her People (Esther 2-9)	"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10).	Everyone can serve God.
WEEK 13	Job Remains Faithful in Suffering (Job 1:1-2:10; 42:1-6, 10-17)	"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint" (Isaiah 40:31).	God brings us hope when we're hurting.



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
