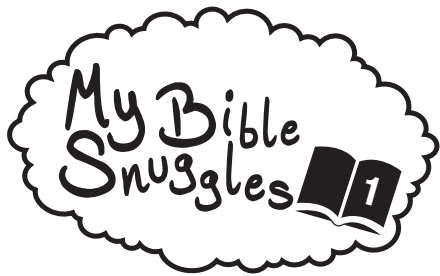

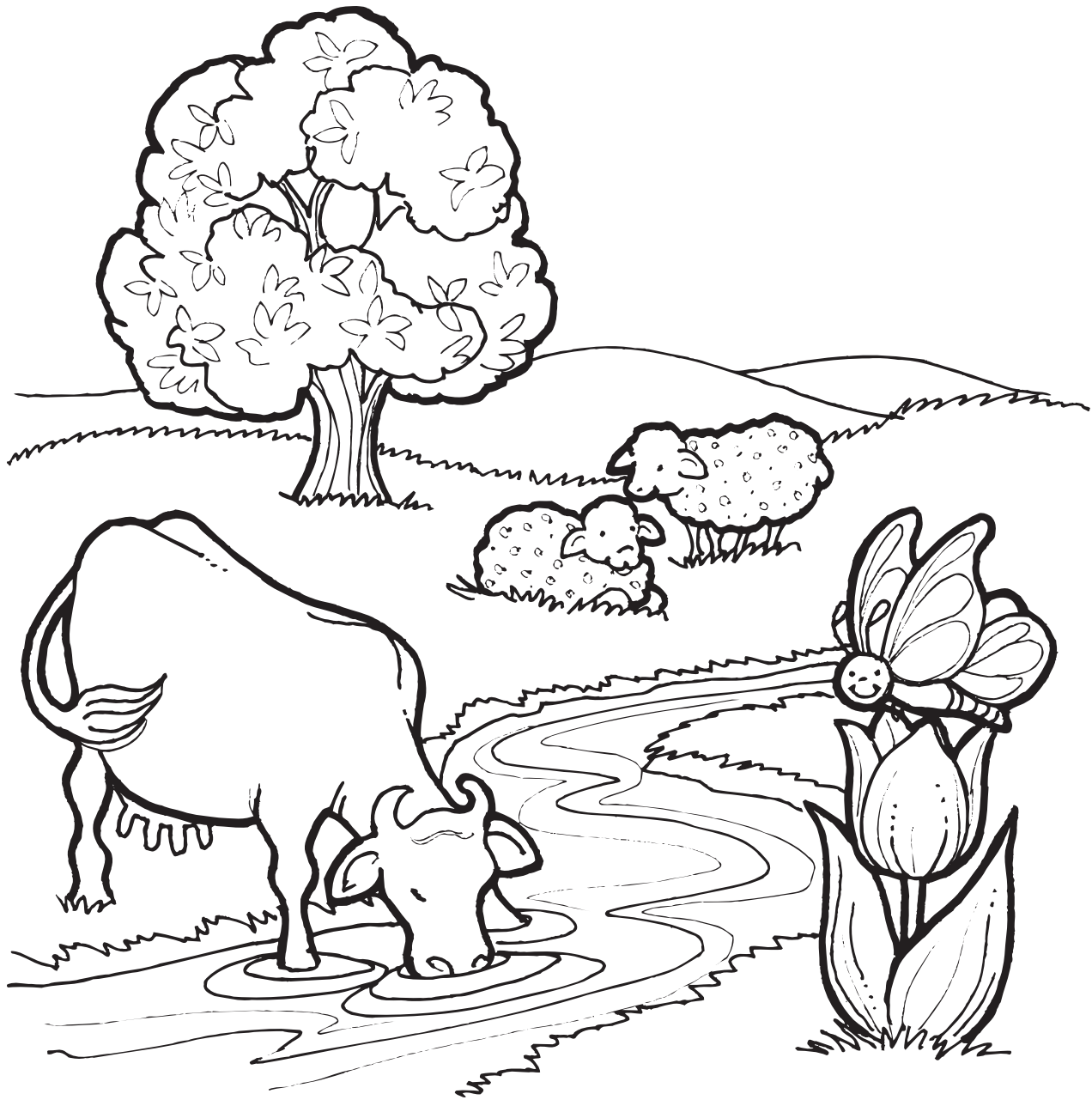

Growing With Jesus



Your child learned that God made everything (from Genesis 1:1–2:3). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Reach and Touch

Get on the floor with your baby for this activity. Lay your infant on his or her tummy. Place a clean nature object, such as a large rock or a large leaf, just out of reach. Tell your baby that God made the object, and encourage him or her to reach out, move toward the object, and touch it.

Say: **God made everything!**

TODDLER

Rock 'n' Seek

Place a clean, fist-sized rock on the floor for your toddler to touch.

Then have your child cover his or her eyes while you hide the rock in the room.

Say: **Where's the rock? Let's go find the rock.** Continue hiding and finding the rock as long as your toddler is interested.

Say: **God made this rock. God made everything.**

2-YEAR-OLD

Creation Sing 'n' Play

Set out nature objects such as a large rock, flowers, and sticks. Sing "God, the Maker" to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell" replacing "world" with each object.

God made the world. God made the world. In my Bible book it says God made the world.

Help your child thank God for each of the objects.

Say: **God made everything!**



God Made It All

Infants and toddlers explore their world from the inside out. First they discover themselves as fingers and toes wave and wiggle and eventually find their way into babies' mouths. Once babies are on the move, they enthusiastically touch, see, smell, hear, and taste God's good creation. On their own, babies and toddlers won't yet connect the Creator to the creations they're experiencing. But you can help your child begin to make the connection by talking about the good things God made for them to enjoy.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- Play Peekaboo with a blanket for "day and night." Explain to your child that God made day and night. Play with stuffed animals and dolls for "animals and people." Help your child thank God for making everything—including us!
- When you go on a walk or a hike, consider allowing your child to walk (or crawl) at his or her own pace for a little while. Rather than pointing out what you find interesting, allow your child to point out what he or she finds interesting. How fun it is to see what grabs a young child's attention!
