Jesus Teaches About Good Fruit

Luke 6:43-45



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Jesus Compares Trees to Authentic Faith

In his references to good and bad trees in this passage, Jesus is obviously drawing an analogy to the fruit that people bear. Notice that the distinction is not between healthy apple trees and diseased apple trees. It is between fruit trees and thorns or briers; it is the kind of tree that makes the difference. Many kinds of trees look good but don't produce fruit. So it is with people. Jesus seems to be saying that a person who is not really a servant of God, no matter how good he or she seems to be, cannot possibly produce fruit for him. Conversely, someone who really is God's servant will automatically produce fruit.

The Heart Is Known Through Actions

Then in Luke 6:45, Jesus expounds on the principle he introduced in the tree metaphor. What comes out of us through our speech and behavior flows from what is within. If what is inside us is good and God-honoring, our lives will honor God. If what is inside us is evil, our lives will not honor God. No matter how hard we try to make good impressions, no one will be fooled for long if our hearts are deceitful.

The Jesus Connection

As we make our relationship with Jesus a priority, we'll find our actions will bear fruit that will please him.

Read aloud Luke 6:43-45. What can you do to store good things in your heart? In what circumstances can you bring good things out of the good you've stored in your heart? If you passionately follow God, the good you've stored will flow out to a needy world. Ask God to show you someone in your church who has a need. And then do the good thing and help that person.



Gently pat a baby's tummy as you ask the questions in the rhyme below. Wiggle your fingers against baby's tummy as you say, "Thank you, God."

Is there an apple in your tummy? Was the apple good and yummy? Thank you, thank you, thank you, God!

Would you like a banana to eat? Would that be a yummy treat? Thank you, thank you, thank you, God!

Are you growing good fruit As you wear that baby suit? Thank you, thank you, God!



Say: ► GOD HELPS US GROW. God is helping your body grow, and God is helping your loving heart to grow. Thank you, thank you, God!

Hold an accordion figure with the paper folded as you say this rhyme:

Here's a happy little [boy or girl] who loves God, this we know.

Let the folded paper open so the legs bounce out, making the figure appear to grow. Do this several times.



Yummy Apples

What You'll Do

Place the teaching picture on the floor, and then gather one or two toddlers near you. Open the Bible to Luke 6:43-45.

Say: The Bible says that God made all kinds of wonderful trees for us to enjoy! This is an apple tree. Let's see what happens to an apple tree. Play "Apple Tree Sounds" (track 3). As the CD segment plays, say: The apple tree sways in the gentle breeze. Can you raise your arms and sway in the breeze? God sends birds to the tree to make their nests. Can you flap your arms like a bird? The birds say, "Thank you, God, for our homes in the trees." God makes fruit grow on the tree! At the sound of each apple growing, place a felt circle on the tree. Turn off the CD after the sixth "boing" sound.

Look at the big, juicy apples on that tree! God helps the apple tree to grow apples. God helps you grow, too. Show me how God is helping you grow tall. Stretch up high! Show me how God is helping you grow strong. Show me your muscles! Show me how God is helping you grow to be more loving. Give me a hug! God is helping you grow! ▶ GOD HELPS US GROW!



Fruit Bracelets

What You'll Do

Wrap a loop of masking tape, sticky side out, on each toddler's wrist.

Say: God is helping you grow each day! You're learning to be kind and loving. God is helping you learn to help and share.

GOD HELPS US GROW. Talk about other positive things you've noticed about each child. Press one piece of fruit-flavored cereal on the masking tape for each attribute you mention.

Look how your bracelets have grown! You have lots of good fruit. Throughout class point out the good fruit on each child's bracelet. God helps [child's name] grow good fruit. The tape may be torn or carefully cut off children's wrists.



Like Good Fruit

What You'll Do

Place the teaching picture on the floor near you. Gather the 2-year-olds.

Say: God made all kinds of wonderful trees for us to enjoy! This is an apple tree. Let's see what happens to an apple tree. Turn on the CD. As the CD segment plays, say: The apple tree sways in the gentle breeze. Can you raise your arms and sway in the breeze? God sends birds to the tree to make their nests. Can you flap your arms like a bird? The birds say, "Thank you, God, for our homes in the trees." God makes fruit grow on the tree! At the sound of each apple growing, place one of the red felt circles on the tree. Have the twos jump each time they hear a "boing" sound.

Soon someone will come to pick the delicious apples. The person will climb a ladder. Climb up! Let's pick the apples. Hear them fall into the basket? Let's climb down so the birds won't be frightened. Now let's sit under the apple tree and rest. Listen to the sound of rustling leaves until the end of the track.

Ask:

What do you think the farmer would do if the apples looked like this?

Hang the gray felt circles in place of the red. Say: These apples don't look good to eat. If all the apples looked like this, the farmer might cut the tree down and plant another one that would grow yummy apples.

Open your Bible to Luke 6:43-45.

Say: Jesus told us that God wants to help us be like the tree that grows good fruit, not like the tree that grows yucky apples. Our fruit is love, kindness, joy, and other good things.

Set out materials you prepared earlier.

Spring Quarter

Say: God is growing good things inside you that others will someday see. Let's print some fruit hearts on these children to remember that ▶ GOD HELPS US GROW. Help each child press the apple half on the sponge and then between the head and feet of each child on the handout.

Ask:

What's something you can do to be loving? What's something you can do to be joyful? You may need to prompt twos by asking, "Can you hug your friend?" or "Can you clap happy praise to God?"

Pray: Thank you, God, for growing good fruit in my friend [child's name].

Fruit Partners

What You'll Do

Form a circle. Have the children pass the apples you counted out earlier as you play "I Am Growing" (track 2) on the CD. When you stop the music, let children join others who are holding the same color apple. Collect the apples, and lead partners in this action rhyme.

Apples grow on tall, tall trees. (Hold hands above heads.)
Grass grows on the ground. (Squat while holding hands.)
But we are special; we're unique. (Stand while holding hands.)
We're growing all around. (Walk around in a circle.)

Say: You don't need to be on a tree to grow like apples or on the ground to grow like grass. You can grow anywhere! ▶ GOD HELPS US GROW.

Fruit Partners Easy Prep

Count out one apple for each child. If you have more than six children in your group, add more apples and have children pair up. Make sure you have more than one color of each apple, whether you have a large or small group.

Tummy Ticklers

Gently pat your baby's tummy as you ask these questions, and wiggle your fingers against baby's tummy as you say, "Thank you, God."

Is there an apple in your tummy? Was the apple good and yummy? Thank you, God! Are you growing good fruit As you wear that baby suit? Thank you, God!

Say: God is helping your body grow, and God is helping your loving heart to grow. Thank you, thank you, thank you, God!

TODDLER

Fruit Bracelets

Encourage your child with this simple game.

Say: God is helping you grow each day! You're learning to be kind and loving. God is helping you learn to help and share. God is helping you grow.

Wrap a loop of masking tape, sticky side out, on your toddler's wrist. Then press one piece of fruit-flavored cereal on the masking tape for each attribute you mention. Talk about other positive things you've noticed about your child.

Say: Look how your bracelet has grown! You have lots of good fruit. God helps [child's name] grow good fruit.

Lead your child in this action rhyme.

Apples grow on tall, tall trees. (Hold hands above heads.)

Grass grows on the ground. (Squat while holding hands.)

But we are special; we're unique. (Stand while holding hands.)

We're growing all around. (Walk around in a circle.)

You don't need to be on a tree to grow like apples or on the ground to grow like grass. You can grow anywhere! God helps us grow. Thank you, God! (Clap your hands.)



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Deep Lessons

Just as you provide a balanced diet for your child, give attention to a balanced spiritual diet, too. Bible stories, natural conversation about God's work in our lives, prayer, and even the chance to demonstrate God's love are all important "nutrients" to feed the growing soul. Every situation offers opportunity to teach young children about the love and nurture of their heavenly Father.


Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:


