

Introduction



Jesus Teaches His Disciples to Pray Matthew 6:5-13

hen a baby coos, a toddler asks for something by name, or a 2-year-old asks a question, the child gets results. Your warms a question, the child gets results. Your warm responses encourage infants and toddlers to reach out and initiate genuine interactions. This cause-and-effect relationship isn't as obvious with prayer, but your responses in typical interactions model for young children how God responds to prayer. Your reactions to a child's effort to reach out to God help the child begin to recognize that God listens. Create a warm atmosphere for interaction and prayer in your room. Tell children often that God loves to hear his little ones pray. This encourages children to continue praying as they mature.

Jesus Teaches His Disciples to Pray

Matthew 6:5-13



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

How Not to Pray

This passage begins with Jesus instructing his followers how *not* to pray. The religious leaders of that time were accustomed to praying loudly on the street corners so that the people would see them as holy and religious. Instead, Jesus says, prayer is to be between the individual and God—sincere communication that is a direct result of one's relationship with God.

Two Basic Parts

Jesus gives this prayer as a pattern or a form—an outline for prayer. One way to understand it better is to break his prayer into two basic parts: adoration and petition.

The first verse of the Lord's Prayer expresses praise for God's majesty and acknowledges God's love for us. The single word we translate as "our father" is an intimate word that can be translated as "daddy" or "dearest father." Jesus lets his followers know that they can share in his close relationship with God.

The first petition in the prayer is not related to personal needs. Rather, it addresses seeking what God wants.

After we seek God's will, we turn to asking God to fulfill personal, daily needs for food, forgiveness, and freedom from temptation. Without God working in our lives and our world, there would be no food or forgiveness. And if Satan were not restricted from tempting us, our lives would be nearly unbearable.

Putting God First

Remember that Jesus insisted on putting God first. If God isn't first in our lives, as well as in our prayers, God will not be honored, no matter how eloquently we pray.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus showed us how to pray, but more importantly, he also set the example of putting God first. Everything Jesus did was for God, so it was only natural for his prayer to be focused on praising God and seeking God's will.

Think of the last prayer you prayed. Maybe it was a quick "God, help me impress my boss" or "Lord, give me patience with my child." There's nothing wrong with quick prayers seeking God's help. But these quick prayers can reveal our real view of God. Consider the motivations behind your last prayer. Did you want to impress your boss or have patience with your child so the other person could see Jesus living in you? Stop and pray now for God to be the center of your life—and your prayers. What You'll Do

Talking to God

What You'll Do

Say: **Jesus and his friends climbed a big mountain.** (walk your fingers up baby's arm from the wrist to the shoulder)

Jesus said, "My friends, let me show you how to pray. (hold baby's palms together between your hands)

God in heaven, you are wonderful! (pat baby's hands on his or her knees)

Please give us food to eat. (rub baby's hands around his or her tummy)

Keep our hearts clean. (pat baby's hand on heart)

We belong to you. (hold baby's arms up)

Amen." (clap baby's hands together twice)

Say: I'm so happy that ▶ WE PRAY TO GOD!



Praying in Action

What You'll Do

Place a baby on his or her back in front of you. Say the following action rhyme. On the word "pray," gently bring the baby's hands together to make praying hands. On the word "talk," bring baby's hands to his or her mouth.

Say: Jesus shows us how to pray, How to pray, how to pray. Jesus shows us how to pray. Oh, we talk to God.

Say: It's good that ▶ WE PRAY TO GOD!

Say: **Jesus said WE PRAY TO GOD.** Whisper softly in baby's ear: **Jesus loves to hear us pray.** If the baby seems to enjoy the sensation of whispering, continue to

Going Hiking!

What You'll Do

Stack several pillows to form a low mound for a mountain, and invite one or two toddlers to climb the pillow mountain while holding your hand. Then separate the pillows, and let each child sit on a pillow while you talk.

Place your Bible in front of the children. Tell children the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Jesus and his special friends climbed a mountain and sat down. Jesus showed his friends how to pray. Can you show me what you do when you pray? God likes it when we talk to him. That's why ▶ WE PRAY TO GOD.

Play the song "Top of the Hill" (track 10 on the CD). Have children make "praying hands" with palms together during the first stanza. During the second stanza, have children stand on the word "up" and fall back onto the pillows on the word "down."

A Mouth to Pray

What You'll Do

Work with one child at a time.

Say: We can use our mouths to talk to God. Show the child the picture on the "Mouth to Pray" page. Uh-oh. This baby doesn't have a mouth. Let's give this baby a mouth. Does baby's mouth go here? Hold the mouth in several different locations on the face. Help the toddler place the mouth in the right spot and glue it in place.

Say: Now baby has a mouth to talk to God. Show me your mouth. You can talk to God, too. ▶ WE PRAY TO GOD!

A Mountain of Prayer

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Matthew 6, and tell children the Bible is God's special book.

Say: Jesus took his friends on a special walk. Do what I do to see what happened.

Climbing up a mountain (pretend to climb with arms and marching feet)
Might take all day. (point to wrist)
Climbing up a mountain (pretend to climb with arms and marching feet)
To learn how to pray. (make praying hands)

Jesus tells his friends (point to several children)
Exactly what to say. (point to mouth)
We can talk to God. (point up)
We do it when we pray. (make praying hands, and sit down)

Say: Jesus said to tell God he is great. Make a muscle. Jesus said to ask God for our food. Touch your fingers and thumb to your mouth. He said to tell God we're sorry when we do wrong things. These things are important to God. That's why ▶ WE PRAY TO GOD.

Pray: God, you're great. Please give us the food we need. We're sorry when we do wrong things. We love you. In Jesus' name, amen.

For the Record

What You'll Do

Allow children to take turns saying "Hi, God" into an audio recorder. After several children have contributed to the recording, play it back. Encourage little ones to guess whose voice they hear.

Say: ► WE PRAY TO GOD. I can pray. You can pray. God knows our voices. God hears us when we pray.

Make a Mouth

What You'll Do

Work with one or two children at a time.

Give each child a set of paper lips and a paper lunch sack. With the sacks folded, demonstrate how to glue the top lip to the upper flap and the bottom lip just below it on the sack. Help kids glue on the lips. After children have finished, show them how to put their hands inside the paper-sack puppets. Show children how to open and shut their hands to make the mouths "talk." Let children use these puppets to talk to God.

As kids talk with their puppets, say: ▶ WE PRAY TO GOD.

Secret Prayers

Whisper softly in baby's ear: God loves to hear us pray. If your baby seems to enjoy the sensation of whispering, continue to whisper affirmations about prayer, such as "You can talk to God about anything! God hears our prayers."

TODDLER

Look Who's Talking

Hold a small mirror so your toddler can see his or her face. Encourage your child to move his or her mouth.

Say: Watch what happens when you talk. Your mouth moves. God sees you when you talk to him. God loves it when you talk to him. We pray to God.

2-YEAR-OLD

For the Record

Let your child say "Hi, God" into an audio recorder. Add to the recording yourself. Then play it back. Let your child identify the voices.

.....

Ask: Who hears you when you pray?

Say: We can pray. I can pray. You can pray. God knows our voices. God hears us when we pray.

Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:

- Take a walk up a nearby hill, or carry your child up a set of stairs in the house. When you reach the top, remind your child that Jesus took his disciples to the top of a hill and taught them how to pray.
- Teach your child a simple prayer to say at dinnertime or bedtime, such as "Thank you, God, for all you do. We love you." Pray aloud together to help your child see that you talk to God, too.
