

experience a little more waiting time to see their wishes acted upon. It's important to be sensitive to each child's patience level. When you notice an infant is in need of a diaper change, taking a moment to address that need will help him or her trust you. Prophets Foretell Jesus' Coming

Jeremiah 33:14-16



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Jeremiah Preaches Hope in Times of Trouble

This passage was written nearly 600 years before Jesus was born. The northern kingdom of Israel had fallen to the Assyrians, who had in turn fallen to the Babylonians. Jeremiah also saw the fall of the southern kingdom of Judah to the Babylonians, concluding with the destruction of Jerusalem in 587 B.C.

Despite all that was going on around him, Jeremiah's message in this passage is one of hope. Repeating nearly word for word the message he had given in Jeremiah 23:5-6, Jeremiah utters here his most important message about the coming Messiah. This King would be a descendant of David but would rule with more wisdom, justice, and righteousness than any other king had ever done. This coming Messiah would not only rescue his people from their oppressors but also reunite the kingdoms of Israel and Judah, which had been divided since the death of Solomon more than 300 years earlier.

Jesus Fulfills Prophecy, but Not as Expected

After reading this passage, it's easy to understand why people of Jesus' day expected a Messiah who would lead them in throwing off Roman rule and restoring the unified kingdom of Israel. From our standpoint in history, we know that Jesus came first as the suffering servant (see Isaiah 53), drawing people to himself through his perfect life and his message of repentance. One day, however, Jesus will return to complete his fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies and rule as king over all heaven and earth.

As we look forward to our celebration of Jesus' birth, we can also look forward to the day Jesus will return to take those who believe in him to live with him in heaven. That's God's message of hope for Christians in today's broken world!

Your relationship with Jesus is an amazing gift. And God planned long ago to give you that gift. Thank him for this life-giving blessing!

Long ago, God chose to prepare the hearts of his people with the news that a Savior would come. As you prepare for Christmas, take some time to allow God's message of hope and salvation to sink in for you. Choose to believe God's promises—and allow the wonder of Jesus' incarnation to overwhelm you. Pray about your heart's desire to live this Christmas season immersed in the meaning of God's promises. God's Promise

What You'll Do

As crawlers are playing on the floor or as you hold an infant, stand a Jeremiah and an Isaiah figure nearby. Hold up the Jeremiah figure, and sway it back and forth.

Say: This is Jeremiah. Jeremiah says, "God told me the days were near When he would send his Son so dear. God kept his promise true. God will always keep promises to you."

Hold up the Isaiah figure.

Say: This is Isaiah. Isaiah says,
"Soon a child will be born.
Expect his birth on Christmas morn.
I have heard what God has spoken.
His promises are never broken."

Still holding up the Isaiah figure, say: God kept his promises to Isaiah. Hold up the Jeremiah figure. God kept his promises to Jeremiah. God sent Jesus! ► GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES to you, too. Gently touch baby's tummy.



Promises for You and Me

What You'll Do

Hold an infant in your lap facing you. Hold baby's hands in yours as you do the motions of this action rhyme together.

Say: ► GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES to [child's name]. (gently tap the baby's tummy with his or her hands)

God keeps his promises to me. (help baby gently tap your tummy) God always keeps his promises. (hold baby's arms out wide)

Just you wait and see! (carefully cover baby's eyes with his or her hands; then pull hands away on "see")

God's Promised Gifts

What You'll Do

Hold an infant in your arms as you look at a picture book or pictures together.

Say: God promised there would be light. See the light? Point to the light. Turn to the next page, and say: God promised there would be ______ (describe what is on the page). See the ______? Point to the item described. Continue to turn the pages of the book while identifying and pointing to each object on the page and recognizing that God promised great things. God promised he would send his Son, Jesus. God kept his promise. ▶ GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES to you, too.



Where's a Prophet?

What You'll Do

Gather two or three toddlers, and have them sit in a circle on the floor. Give each child two prophet puppets. Help children hold the puppets by putting the ends of the cardboard tubes over the first two fingers on each of their hands. Explain that these puppet men were called prophets.

Ask: Where's a prophet? Help toddlers each wiggle one finger puppet.

Say: There he is! Prophets gave God's message that Jesus would be born! God keeps his promises. Where's another prophet? Help children each wiggle the other finger puppet as you talk. There he is! Many prophets told that God would send a Savior. ▶ GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES. God sent Jesus as a tiny little baby. God will keep his promises to you, too.

Here's the Prophet

What You'll Do

Have a toddler sit near you. Help the toddler hold the Jeremiah puppet on his or her fingers. Hold the Isaiah puppet on your first two fingers. Help the toddler with the motions in the parentheses as you do this finger play.

Say: Here's the prophet Isaiah; (bow the Isaiah puppet)
Jeremiah, too. (help child bow the Jeremiah puppet)
God gave them a message
To give to me and you.

"Jesus will be born,"
Said prophet number one. (bow the Isaiah puppet)
Said prophet number two, (help child bow the Jeremiah puppet)
"He will be God's Son."

God gave this prophet a promise; (bow the Isaiah puppet)
And one to this one, too. (help child bow the Jeremiah puppet)
God always keeps his promises.
We know that to be true.

Say: God promised to send his Son, Jesus, so you could be friends with him. Jesus was born on Christmas, just as God promised. ▶ GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES. Thank you, God. We love you, Jesus.

The Prophet Says

What You'll Do

Gather three or four toddlers, and have them sit with you on the floor. Give either an Isaiah or a Jeremiah puppet to one of the children.

Say: The prophet gave [child's name] God's message. The prophet said, "Jesus is coming!" Can you give God's message to [another child's name]? Encourage the child to hand the puppet to the other child you named and to repeat the phrase "Jesus is coming." Continue in this fashion until each child has had a turn to give the message.

Jesus came at Christmastime. God kept his promise. ▶ GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES to you, too.

Hear the Prophets' Words

What You'll Do

Gather two or three 2-year-olds, and have them sit in a circle on the floor. Give each child two prophet puppets. Help children hold the puppets by putting the ends of the cardboard tubes over the first two fingers on each of their hands. Open your Bible to Jeremiah 33, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible tells about two men named Isaiah and Jeremiah. They were called prophets. They spoke for God. Where is Isaiah? Encourage children to wiggle a puppet and answer, "Here I am." God wanted Isaiah to tell people that Jesus would be born. Help children wiggle the puppet and say, "God said, 'Jesus will be born.' "Where is Jeremiah? Encourage children to wiggle the other puppet and answer, "Here I am." God also wanted Jeremiah to tell people that Jesus would be born. Encourage children to wiggle the puppet and say, "God said, 'Jesus will be born.' "

Say: For God KEEPS HIS PROMISES. Jesus was born on Christmas. God kept his promises then. God will keep his promises to you, too. Let your prophets take a bow. Help children bend both index fingers so the puppets bow.



Listen to the Prophets

What You'll Do

Gather three or four 2-year-olds near you on the floor. Have two children put the prophet puppets on their fingers. Have the other children do the action-rhyme motions with you. After saying the rhyme once, let the children switch roles.

"A new baby child will be born someday. (pretend to cradle a baby in your arms, swinging your arms back and forth)

This little baby will be God's own Son. (point up)

A baby called Prince of Peace, the Chosen One." (swing cradled arms back and forth) What the prophets told, we all can believe. (point to the prophet puppets)

For ▶ GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES—yes, indeed! (point up, and nod head)

Afterward, say: God kept his promise by sending us Jesus. God will keep his promises to you, too.

Weaving Faith at Home Easy Prep

Remove the letter to parents from the back of each student book and the Lesson 1 "Growing With Jesus" pages from each student book. Then have the child who's walking around the circle choose a person to become the next prophet. Have the child holding the puppet tell the new "prophet" that Jesus is coming and give that child the puppet.

Say: The prophet's message was told over and over. Now the message has come to [chosen child's name].

Have the new prophet walk around the circle as the group sings. Continue the game until each child has had a turn.

Say: The prophet's message was that God promised to send us his Son, Jesus. God kept his promise. ▶ GOD KEEPS HIS PROMISES to you, too.

Growing With Jesus



Promises to Keep

As children learn to depend on their parents, they gain the ability to rely on God as well. A prompt response to infants' needs helps them to feel that we're dependable. In fact, children whose needs are promptly attended to are more likely to be able to wait when necessary. As your child grows, it'll be increasingly important to be reliable-to keep promises both expressed and implied. Whether you promise a cookie or a timeout, follow-through is important. Experiences with these little things form young children's understanding of promise keeping.



Your child learned God keeps his promises (from Jeremiah 33:14-16). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Promises for You and Me

Hold your infant in your lap facing you. Hold your baby's hands in yours as you do the motions of this action rhyme together.

Say: God keeps his promises to [child's name]. (gently tap your baby's tummy with his or her hands)

God keeps his promises to me. (help your baby gently tap your tummy) God always keeps his promises. (hold your

baby's arms out wide)

Just you wait and see!
(carefully cover your
baby's eyes with his
or her hands; then pull
hands away on "see")

TODDLER

The Prophet Says

Make a finger puppet with your child to represent either the prophet Isaiah or Jeremiah.

Say: The prophet gave [child's name]
God's message. The prophet said, "Jesus is coming!" Can you give God's message to me?
Encourage your child to hand the finger puppet to you as he or she repeats the phrase "Jesus is coming." Continue back and forth until your child is no longer interested.

Jesus came at Christmastime. God kept his promise. God keeps his promises to you, too.

2-YEAR-OLD

Listen to the Prophets

Do this action rhyme with your child.

Say: I see the prophets with my eyes. (point to eyes)

With my ears I hear their surprise. (point to ears)
The prophets were told to say, (point to mouth)
"A believe!!! he have

"A baby will be born someday. (cradle a baby in arms)

This little baby is God's own Son. (point up)
The Prince of Peace, the Chosen One." (swing cradled arms)

What the prophets told, we can believe. (point to mouth)

God keeps his promises—yes, indeed! (nod head)

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

- As you take a walk, look for lights, Christmas trees, or other decorations. Tell your child that these changes remind us that Christmas is coming, just like the prophets' words reminded all people that Jesus would be born.
- Make a finger puppet with your child to represent either the prophet Isaiah or Jeremiah. Ask, "Where's the prophet? What does the prophet say?" Encourage your child to hold up the puppet and remember that Jesus' birthday is coming.


