

Solomon Tells of Jesus' Coming

Psalm 72:1-19



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Writing Psalm 72

Some believe that Psalm 72 was written about Solomon and not by him. It is true that some elements of the psalm could well describe Solomon, but many elements describe a king whose actions go far beyond Solomon's capabilities. The early church believed that this psalm was written as a prayer for a king to come in the line of David and Solomon: the Messiah, Jesus. That's the approach taken in today's lesson.

The Psalmist Points Beyond Himself

Some elements of the psalm could indeed describe Solomon. He judged righteously and with great wisdom, as illustrated in the story of the two women who each claimed to be the mother of the same infant (1 Kings 3:16-28). He reigned over a prosperous kingdom, the wealthiest in Israel's history. He expanded the boundaries of the kingdom to encompass more territory than ever before. And he was sought by the queen of Sheba, who came to him bearing gifts.

However, much of this psalm points directly to the Messiah. Only Jesus' kingdom will truly extend to the ends of the earth (Psalm 72:8), and only to Jesus will all rulers eventually bow down (Psalm 72:11). There isn't a lot of biblical evidence that Solomon cared for the needy and afflicted (Psalm 72:12-14), but Jesus' life and ministry were characterized by such caring. And while the statement that all nations would be blessed through him (Psalm 72:17) could possibly refer to Solomon indirectly, it definitely refers to Jesus.

The Works of the Messiah

If Jesus is indeed the subject of Psalm 72, it is easy to answer the question: What does Jesus do? Jesus does amazing things for us! He takes care of the needy and their children, and he defeats oppressors (Psalm 72:4, 12-14). He lives forever, despite the fact that he died on the cross for us (Psalm 72:5). When he returns, Jesus will reign over the entire earth (Psalm 72:8). Surely he deserves from us the same kind of praise and honor given in verses 18 and 19!

The Jesus Connection

We've learned about many different facets of Jesus' life and ministry on earth. But let's never forget what Jesus has done for us. He is worthy of all our praise for that alone.

What's the first thing that comes to mind when you think about Jesus?

Who is Jesus to you? A teacher...a minister...a

preachera martyra savior? Concentrate on the last one—savior. Spend two minutes prayerfully considering how Jesus is your Savior. You can write your prayer here.

He's like the rain that comes down. (lower baby's hands to knee level)

Have each child hold or touch a can of food. As kids touch the cans, encourage them to pat their tummies. Say: Mm-mm. Jesus gives us good food to eat. We can share this good food. Help kids place the cans inside the grocery bag. ▶ JESUS DOES GREAT THINGS.

What You'll Do

Give each child a "Crown" page. Open your Bible to Psalm 72.

Say: This is God's special book. In God's book, we learn about a man who wrote a song about how ▶ JESUS DOES GREAT THINGS. When I say something great that Jesus does, I'll clap my hands—and you clap with me. Let's practice. Clap your hands and encourage kids to clap with you. Then you can take a jewel sticker and add it to your crown.

Jesus is a good king. Pause and clap. Jesus takes care of people who are sad and hurt. Pause and clap. Jesus helps people stop fighting. Pause and clap. Jesus loves each of us. Pause and clap.

▶ JESUS DOES GREAT THINGS. Our pretty crowns will remind us how great Jesus is.



Scepters

What You'll Do

Set out paper-towel tubes, markers, and bandages.

Say: Today we learned that Jesus is a king who does great things. A king carries a scepter. A scepter is a fancy stick that lets everyone know the king is special. Let's make scepters for Jesus to remind us of the great things he does. Give each child a tube, and help kids decorate their tubes with markers.

We learned that Jesus takes care of hurting people. Let's put bandages on our scepters to remind us. Give children each a bandage or two, and help kids apply the bandages to their scepters. We learned that Jesus shows love to people. Let's decorate our scepters with hearts to remind us. Help children each draw a big red heart on their tube.

Say: ► JESUS DOES GREAT THINGS. When you look at your scepters, you'll remember the great things Jesus does.

Homage

What You'll Do

Have children sit in a circle, and set out the cans of food.

Say: People from far away would bring Jesus gifts. We can bring Jesus gifts, too. One gift we can give is food to people who need it. Let's pretend we're giving Jesus a gift by sharing food.

Pick up a can of food. Encourage children to do the same and follow you as you march around. March for about 30 seconds, and then have children return to the circle and stack the cans in a pile. Tell kids you will give the food to other people.

Pray: Jesus, we give you this food as a gift. Thanks for all the great things you do. In Jesus' name, amen.

Growing With Jesus



Wide-Eyed Wonder

As young children watch their parents and other adults, they may feel that adults can do anything. As children mature they will lose this sense of awe. However, we can increase a child's sense of wonder at what Jesus does by communicating admiration and enthusiasm as we tell Bible stories about Jesus.

Your child learned that God helps us just as he helped David and gave him a crown (from Psalm 72:1-19). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can do these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Shine

Dim the room lights, and let your baby play with a small, pen-sized flashlight. Help your baby point the beam of light around the room.

Say: The Bible says that the great things that Jesus does will last as long as the sun. This flashlight gives us light like the sun does.

TODDLER

All in a Day's Work

Say: Jesus does great things. Read the following list, and do the motions in the parentheses with your child:

Jesus is a good and loving king. (hug your toddler)

Jesus takes care of people who are sad or hurt. (pat your toddler)

Jesus helps people stop fighting. (hug your toddler)

Everyone can sing happy songs to Jesus. (sing "Jesus Loves Me")

2-YEAR-OLD

Homage

Say: Lots of people brought Jesus gifts. We can bring Jesus gifts, too.

Encourage your child to find a prized toy or stuffed animal. Then have your child follow as you march around the room. Then stop and have your child set down the prized item. Say: We can bring our gifts to Jesus.



OK TO COPY

Help your child become a FaithWeaver with these ideas:


- Take your child along as you donate items such as food, money, or clothing. Tell your child that sharing what we have is just like giving Jesus gifts.
