### Jesus Teaches About Good Fruit

Luke 6:43-45

A t this age, students probably haven't realized that they can have a lifelong effect on another person. Throughout this study, focus on how important their lives are. Telling stories of your own teenage years, including specific details about the things you remember people saying and doing, helps them see how those moments had a lifelong impact on you. Then draw the comparison that each day they are saying and doing things that their friends may remember years from now!



## Jesus Teaches About Good Fruit

Luke 6:43-45



## Jesus Compares Trees to Authentic Faith

In his references to good and bad trees in this passage, Jesus is obviously drawing an analogy to the fruit that people bear. Notice that the distinction is not between healthy apple trees and diseased apple trees. It is between fruit trees and thorns or briers; it is the kind of tree that makes the difference. Many kinds of trees look good but don't produce fruit. So it is with people. Jesus seems to be saying that a person who is not really a servant of God, no matter how good he or she seems to be, cannot possibly produce fruit for him. Conversely, someone who really is God's servant will automatically produce fruit.

## The Heart Is Known Through Actions

•••••

Then in Luke 6:45, Jesus expounds on the principle he introduced in the tree metaphor. What comes out of us through our speech and behavior flows from what is within. If what is inside us is good and God-honoring, our lives will honor God. If what is inside us is evil, our lives will not honor God. No matter how hard we try to make good impressions, no one will be fooled for long if our hearts are deceitful.

#### The Jesus Connection

As we make our relationship with Jesus a priority, we'll find our actions will bear fruit that will please him.

Read aloud Luke 6:43-45. What can you do to store good things in your heart? In what circumstances can you bring good things out of the good you've stored in your heart? If you passionately follow God, the good you've stored will flow out to a needy world. Ask God to show you someone in your church who has a need. And then do the good thing and help that person.

#### Stick It to Them

#### What You'll Do

In this game, students will need to form groups of three to five. Gather them around the sheet (or plastic tarp) you laid down earlier.

Say: In this game you'll see how it pays to do good deeds! In your group, one person volunteers to have his or her hands covered in shaving cream. The volunteer will hold his or her hands straight out, perpendicular to the floor, in what looks like a "stop" gesture. The rest of you should think of good deeds you did this past week. Then members of your group will stand a few feet away with a bunch of cotton balls. For each good deed your group thought of, you can try to throw a cotton ball onto the shaving cream. See how many you can get to stay—but you can throw only as many as the number of good deeds you did last week. Go!

Let your students play for a while. Say: Bet you're glad for every good deed you did last week, huh? Think about all those cotton balls that stuck. Sometimes our good deeds stick to other people, too. They leave a lasting impression on them.

#### Talk With Students

Lead students in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- Have you ever seen a good deed "stick" to someone? Was it something you did or something that happened to you? Explain.
- How does it feel to know that the things you do stick to people? What responsibility does that give you?
- How do you think people show they're Christians?

Say: Today we're going to think about how we can have a good influence on others. We'll look at how we bear spiritual fruit in the world to touch the lives of people around us because ► ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS.

#### What You'll Do

Instead of doing the "Stick It to Them" activity, watch a clip from *Pay It Forward*. Set up the clip by saying: In this movie a young boy experiences the power of good works. Watch how his generosity spreads to others.

Show the clip. Begin at 00:30:10 when Trevor's mother walks into the garage. End the clip at 00:34:50, when she says, "Would you like a cup of coffee?"

#### **Talk With Students**

Lead students in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- How did Trevor's good deeds affect others?
- How do you think you have an ongoing effect on others?

What does it feel like to know that you might?

Say: Today we'll see how our good deeds influence the people around us. We'll see that God wants us to bear spiritual fruit that will change the world, even if we do it one person at a time. Whether we realize it or not, ▶ ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS.



#### **Choose Your Own Adventure**

#### What You'll Do

Say: In our adventures today, we have two activities you can choose from. Adventure 1 uses an object lesson and poetry, and Adventure 2 uses body art. The directions are on your Bible Trek papers. Look them over and decide which activity you want to do. You can work with the others who choose the same activity. Allow time for students to decide which adventure they want to do. Summaries of each adventure follow.

**ADVENTURE 1—OBJECT LESSON AND POETRY:** FRIED FRUIT In this adventure, students will visualize the good and bad fruit of Luke 6.

#### **ADVENTURE 2-BODY ART: BEARING IT ALL**

In this adventure, students will create visual images of how the good and bad fruit of others has affected them.

Say: After you finish your adventure, you'll present some of what you experienced, so keep that in mind. When everyone has finished, we'll talk about what we've learned. You have 10 minutes to complete your adventures. While students are working, move between the stations, and offer assistance as needed. Let groups know

#### Talk With Students

Lead students in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- How does it feel to think about the "bad fruit" in the world?
- What does that motivate you to do?
- What kind of influence do you think you have on other people?
- How can we show we're Christians?

Say: ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS. Now let's think of some practical ways that we can bear good fruit in our lives.

#### A Sweet Invitation

#### What You'll Do

Help students experience the power that good deeds can have on their friends.

Say: Now we'll see how our good deeds can have a major effect on others. I'm going to pass a tray of fruit to one person. When I do, I'll tell the person one way that I'm going to display spiritual fruit this week. I might say, "This week I'm going to volunteer at a homeless shelter" or "This week I'm going to be more patient." When you receive the tray, help yourself to whatever you want, and then pass it on in the same way.

Begin by passing the tray to one student (for larger groups, you might use two or three trays and pass them to the students). Wait until the tray(s) go around the room.

Say: The Bible compares heaven to a big banquet with lots of food. When people see the good fruit of our lives, it's like giving them an invitation to get to know God and come to the banquet. Someone may see your good works and want to know why you live the way you do. It's like you handed them an invitation to heaven.

#### Talk With Students

Lead students in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- Why did you choose to say the things you did?
- How do you think people will react when you do what you've planned?

Say: Remember that ▶ ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS. Whether or not we do good works perfectly, God has the power to use them to touch other people. God lets us be the messengers, but he's still in charge of the message!

## Don't Shoot the Messenger

#### What You'll Do

In this activity all students can take part, even if they don't stand in front of the group.

Say: The way we live our lives says a lot about what we're living for. If we believe God has sent us into the world with a purpose, that purpose will shine through a lot of what we do.

I'm going to invite volunteers forward. Each volunteer is a messenger sent here to deliver a message to the group. By listening to the message, try to determine who sent the messenger. Those who don't want to volunteer can help guess who the messenger represents.

Give slips of paper with scenarios on them to the volunteers. Use the scenarios from the "Don't Shoot the Messenger" handout. If you want to, you may have students form smaller groups and add your own scenarios so more students can be messengers.

Proceed with the activity, allowing students to take guesses.

#### Talk With Students

Lead students in this discussion.

#### Ask:

- Was it easy or difficult to tell who sent the messenger? Why?
- How could you tell who sent the messenger?
- In our lives, how are we messengers? How can people tell who's influencing us?

Have students form pairs. Have them read the Key Verse, Matthew 5:16, together: "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."

#### Ask:

- If your life were a message to your friends, what would it say?
- How can we show we're Christians?

Say: God has a great message of love for the world. We become the messengers in the good deeds that we do. It's as if God is a writer, you are the pen, and your life is the letter. Think about what message God is writing through you.

#### **Daily Challenges**

#### What You'll Do

Direct students to the Daily Challenges in their Bible Trek pages, and have them choose one to do this week. They can choose one or more of these three options:

- Do one random act of kindness in secret for someone at school this week. (Don't get caught, or it doesn't count!)
- In what areas do you bring honor to Christ by your actions? In what areas do you fall short? Choose one behavior that you could improve upon, and resolve to do things differently for the next seven days.
- Make a yummy, fresh fruit salad for your family. As you serve your family members, share with them what you've learned this week about what it means to bear good fruit for Jesus Christ.

#### Talk With Students

Lead students in this discussion.

#### Ask:

What's a practical way you're going to do your Daily Challenge? Include a time, place, and other ideas.

Say: ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS. Let's act like Jesus this week by following through with our Daily Challenges.

#### Weaving Faith at Home

Hand out a letter to parents from the Bible Trek student books, one to each student. Also encourage students to talk with their parents about the Daily Challenges they chose and what they learned about bearing good fruit. Students can also do the activities on the "Bringing It Home" section of their Bible Trek pages with their families.

Close with prayer. Have pairs pray that their lives would bear good fruit and people might come to know God because of them. Invite them to pray specifically for one person they know.




