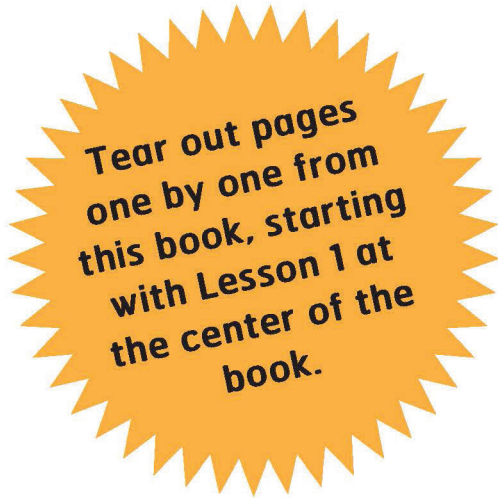


Relational

Read this quote with your family, and then talk it over.

- **Political leaders of all sorts are only leaders if people are following them. Do you think Jesus is a leader worth following even if nobody else follows? Why or why not?**
- **Why might someone look at your family and decide you’re following Jesus? Why might someone conclude you’re NOT Jesus-followers?**

- Follow Jesus by taking a risk to stand up for your faith.

- Pray about any big decisions this week and journal about them, committing to follow Jesus in whatever decision you make.

- Find a partner, commit to a way to follow Jesus, and call or text each other every day to share how it’s going.

Daily Challenge

Try This

In many cultures, history is passed along orally. That is, there isn’t a written history, just a series of stories that capture events from the past. Have each family member place one item that reminds him or her of following Jesus in a shoe box or other container. Maybe it’s a baby shoe that’s long been outgrown and is a reminder of someone taking a first step in following. Or it might be a checker piece from an old game your family played while showing Jesus’ love. Whatever the item, ask the person who picks it to tell the story. Keep the box where you can add items throughout the week to create an oral history of how you’re following Jesus.

BIBLE POINT: Commit to follow Jesus.

KEY VERSE: "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile" (Romans 1:16).

Jesus Teaches About Commitment

MARK 8:31-38

Think It Over

First Peter answers one of Jesus' questions correctly. But then Peter tries to tell Jesus he's wrong about something else. That doesn't go over so well.

Peter was having the ultimate bad day.

What's a fisherman to do?

Follow, that's what.

Peter forgot that Jesus was in charge. Even if Peter wasn't happy about hearing Jesus predict that a cross was waiting for Jesus, he sure wasn't in any position to challenge the point.

Jesus was the Messiah—Peter wasn't. Jesus was in charge—Peter wasn't. Jesus was setting the agenda—Peter wasn't.

So Peter learned a lesson we need to learn (and relearn), too: When we follow Jesus, we follow him no matter what. No matter where. No matter when.

- Describe a time you followed Jesus even though it was hard.

- What's something you think Jesus wants you to do? Why?

- Why is it worth it to follow Jesus despite the cost?

Join Together

Here's What You Need to Do...

1. TO START OFF...

Say hi to the other people in your group. Then, with your group, follow the rest of the instructions for your adventure!

2. GET SUPPLIES.

You'll need a ball of string or yarn. If you have more than 15 students in your group, form two smaller groups and cut two long pieces of string.

3. START BONDING!

You've been thinking and talking and reading about what it means to follow Jesus. And one of the most important things to following Jesus is encouragement! This activity will help demonstrate both how unifying and how encouraging it is to be surrounded by people who also want to follow Jesus.

4. THREAD THE STRING THROUGH.

One person should take an end of the string and thread it through his or her

clothes. You can all decide on how you want this to go—the easiest way is probably in the collar and out a sleeve. Even though this will also be a serious time, make a rule such as you can't help the string through but can only drop it in and then shake it around until it comes out again. Just don't lose it! Because once the first person threads the string through, the second person will sit (or stand) next to the first person and do the same thing. You'll follow each other until you're all in a line, connected by the string. But don't start yet because that's not all...

5. THE MOST IMPORTANT PART.

After each of you gets the string through and hands it to the next person, you must share one thing about the way you feel about following Jesus. Is it a scary thing? challenging? comforting? Also, think of how this will encourage someone else in following Jesus.

6. TALK ABOUT IT.

Once you're all connected and have shared what it means to you to follow Jesus, discuss what you just did.

- How was this activity fun? How was it challenging? How is this sometimes just like following Jesus?
- What feelings do you have about following Jesus? Are you happy with the way you feel, or would you want something to change?
- What did this exercise teach you about yourself? about others in your group?

Encouraging Words

Here's What You Need to Do...

1. TO START OFF...

Say hi to the other people in your group. Then, with your group, follow the rest of the instructions for your adventure!

2. FORM PAIRS.

You'll work with your partner to create an encouraging analogy you'd like to read if you were struggling to follow Jesus. If you're struggling with following Jesus right now, prepare to be encouraged.

3. WRITE.

You'll need paper and a pen. One person in your pair is the Word-smith and the other is the Chief Scribe. Your goal is to draft one or more analogies that reassure someone who's struggling and remind him or her of the benefits of following Jesus. For example,

you might write about someone who stopped buying candy to save up for an iPad, and why those sacrifices were worth the cost. Then compare that with the benefits of following Jesus.

4. SHARE.

Read your best analogy to the other pairs, and be encouraged as they read theirs.

5. TALK ABOUT IT.

- What did the analogies you wrote reveal about the obstacles you expect to come up against when you're following Jesus?
- What did they reveal about the benefits?

6. PREPARE TO SHARE.

As a whole group, pick a few analogies to share with the other adventure group.
