


- How does fear sometimes bring us closer to God?
- How have you experienced God helping you to trust him with your fears or struggles?
- God promises us he'll be with us no matter where we are or what we're doing. How can that comfort you?



Look at the top news online, and find articles that deal with people being afraid. You can look for articles on a worldwide or local paper's website. Each family member can choose two to three stories and talk about why these people may be afraid and how God can help them in their fear. Pray for the people in these articles.



• Share a fear with a Christian

friend or family member, and get advice on how to tackle it.

Do something that you fear (such as talking to the new kid in school or visiting with elderly people), but make sure it's safe and acceptable! (No parachuting off the roof of your house!)
When you face a fear, think about the good and bad reactions you thought of. Pray that God will help you choose to trust him rather than dwell in fear.



Sunday/ISAIAH 41:10 • How do you need God's strength this week to help you with a specific fear?

Monday/PHILIPPIANS 4:6-7 • How often do you respond this way when you have fear? What helps or hinders you?

**TUESDAY**/PSALM 27:1 • How is the Lord your light, salvation, and stronghold?

Wednesday/PSALM 34:4 • What scares you this week? How are you seeking the Lord because of that fear? Thursday/JOHN 14:27 • How can peace help us not to be afraid?

Friday/JOSHUA 1:9 • Why is it comforting to you knowing that God is with you wherever you go?

Saturday/ISAIAH 43:1-4 • How does this verse help you with your fears?

#### **BIBLE POINT:** God helps us when we're afraid.

Exodus 13:17-14:31 Think It Over

Ever see a scary movie and become convinced it'll happen to you? Or what about a more substantial fear—like fear of failure or humiliation? The Israelites had to deal with some pretty big fears. They could see their enemy, and it was a huge army with spears and chariots and a lot of really angry people. The Israelites had been slaves for more than 500 years—what did they know about fighting? The Israelites were stuck between a large body of water and a very, very large army, and somehow they came away unharmed. God took care of them, one miracle after another.

 How do you react when you get scared?



#### 5. SHARE IT!

Pick four people to share what your sculptures mean and what you discussed. Have fun with it!

#### **2.** DIGGING INTO THE WORD...

Read Exodus 13:17-22. Then discuss these questions together:

- What just happened in this passage?
- What were the Israelites afraid of? Why?

• How was God watching over them? Now take turns reading Exodus 14:1-9 and Exodus 14:10-31, and answer the same questions for each passage.

#### **3.** YOU ARE IN CHARGE.

You are screenwriters for God's next big miracle. How else could God have led the Israelites through the desert? Brainstorm other options for how God could have led them (like a magical map or a dotted line in the sand). Pick one of your best ideas, and practice it as a brief drama for a presentation for the other adventure group. You could choose to write this brief drama

Now read Exodus 14:1-20 and come up with another alternative drama. Do the same for Exodus 14:21-31.

### 5. SHARE IT!



WEEK 5	God Gives the Ten Commandments (Part 2) (Exodus 19:16-20:21)	" 'Do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not give false testimony, honor your father and mother,' and 'love your neighbor as yourself' " (Matthew 19:18-19).	God tells us how to respect others.
WEEK 6	The Israelites Worship a Golden Calf (Exodus 32:1-25)	"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:2-3).	Only God deserves our worship.
WEEK 7	The Israelites Build the Tabernacle (Exodus 35:4–36:38)	"And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:17).	We all can serve God.
WEEK 8	Moses Sends Spies Into the Promised Land (Numbers 13:1-14:23)	"Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58).	Be brave for God.
WEEK 9	Balaam's Donkey Talks (Numbers 22:1-38)	"Come and see what God has done, how awesome his works in man's behalf!" (Psalm 66:5).	Pay attention to God.
WEEK 10	Joshua Becomes Leader of Israel (Joshua 1:1-11)	"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9).	God is with us.
WEEK 11	Joshua Sends Spies to Jericho (Joshua 2:1-24)	"And without faith it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6).	We can have faith that God will do big things in our lives.
WEEK 12	The Israelites Cross the Jordan River (Joshua 3:1-4:24)	"Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done" (1 Chronicles 16:8).	Remember what God has done.
WEEK 13	God Gives Victory Over Jericho (Joshua 6:1-27)	"Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:6-7).	God's power works for good.



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
