



Daily

No one has to abide by anyone else's rules if he or she doesn't want to. It's every person for himself or herself! 1. To START OFF...

Say hi to the other people in your group. Then, with your group, follow the rest of the instructions for your adventure!

2. MAKE A LIST.

Find a place to sit by yourself, where you'll really be able to focus. Grab a pen, and use the notes section to make a

list of as many things you can think of that are an important or frequent part of your life. You can include objects (like pizza), events (like basketball games), people (like your English teacher), or anything else that takes up a lot of your time or attention. List as many things as you can think of in five minutes.

3. CHECK IT TWICE.

Now read through your list, and cross out the things that represent disobedience. Maybe it's not that the thing itself is disobedient, but it's an area you disobey in a lot. Talk to God about how you can give those things to him as a sacrifice.

4. DISCUSS.

Now get back together with your adventure group and discuss these questions:

2. TALK IT UP.

So you don't have your license yet, but you will in a few years. Imagine what it's like to cruise down the street in your own car. But don't cruise too fast—you could get a ticket.

As a group, brainstorm as many rules and laws as you can think of that a driver has to follow to be safe and legal, and list them in the notes section. (Here are some hints to get you started: obeying speed limits and driving on the right side of the street.)

3. THINK IT THROUGH.

Now brainstorm what the consequences would be for disobeying each of the laws and rules that you came up with.

4. REWARD YOURSELF.

Talk about the benefits of being a safe and obedient driver.

5. RELATE IT TO REAL LIFE.

So how does this relate to real life? Well, God has rules and commands he wants you to obey. Find a partner, and discuss at least one way you need to obey God in your life. Make sure you also talk about the benefits of obeying God in that way.

6. THE FINISH LINE...

Notes:

Come up with a creative way to share what you did with the students in the other adventure group. For example, you could make a short quiz on some of the driving rules you discovered and see how they do. Then you could share three main points from your discussion.

- What were some of the things you crossed out? In what ways do they represent disobedience?
- What would it look like to truly sacrifice those areas of disobedience?

5. PREPARE TO SHARE.


Think of a creative way to share what your adventure group did. Maybe you'll each read one thing you didn't cross out, and then turn your backs to the group and share one thing you did cross out.

WEEK 6	Joseph's Brothers Sell Him Into Slavery (Genesis 37:12-36)	"Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth" (1 John 3:18).	God wants us to do what's right.
WEEK 7	Pharaoh Puts Joseph in Charge (Genesis 39:20-41:49)	"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23).	We can serve God anywhere.
WEEK 8	Joseph Forgives His Brothers (Genesis 42–45)	"Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you" (Colossians 3:13).	God wants us to forgive.
