

The Israelites Cross the Red Sea

Exodus 13:17-14:31



► Bible Point God helps us when we're afraid.

Key Verse

God Cares for His People

As the mass of more than 2 million Hebrews left Egypt, God knew that facing the warlike Philistines immediately would likely have made the Hebrews lose hope and turn back to Egypt. The pillar of cloud by day and pillar of fire by night must have been awesome and comforting.

God's Unusual Strategy

God instructed the Israelites to turn back somewhat toward Egypt and camp at a spot between Migdol and the Red Sea. God had a bigger plan than anyone else could know. Pharaoh would've been confident that he could easily defeat the Israelites.

The Israelites were slaves of the Egyptians only days prior to this event. They'd been beaten by the whips of the slave drivers and were familiar with the weapons the Egyptians carried. They must've realized that their fighting talents were nothing compared with the Egyptians'. And they were backed against the sea, with mountains on two sides and the Egyptians bearing down on them. The situation must've seemed hopeless.

God Shows His Power

We can realize that God had all this planned. He knew that the people would be frightened. He knew that they would doubt him. But he also knew that his power would be remembered forever. God knew that he would prevail, that the Hebrews would be saved from Pharaoh, and that the result would be a people growing greatly in their faith in him.

It may seem odd that no record of this event has been found in Egyptian history. However, it's likely that all records

were wiped from the books because it would've been an embarrassment for the world to know that mighty Egypt had been devastated by its own lowly slaves.

WEAVING FAITH

What a friend we have in Jesus! Jesus wants to hear all about our lives-not just the good stuff, but our concerns and fears, too. Jesus wants to help us when we're afraid. In the case



of the Israelites, God rescued them from the pursuing Egyptians. Sometimes God will rescue us from whatever it is we fear, too. But other times he responds to our prayers by giving us his indescribable strength to face our fears. God's peace can make our fears evaporate. What are you and your kids facing that you fear? How can God change you in the face of those fears? Ask God to give you and your family his strength and peace to face any fears.

Insight for Parents ■■■■■■

Enlist your whole family in creating a poster or other work of art that'll help you all remember the ways God has helped your family. Use the title "I am the Lord your God who...." Update the poster every time God helps a family member amid fear.

Faith Talk Starter

Talk about a time your family faced a scary situation. Maybe you were trapped in a car during a violent storm, or perhaps your house was broken into. Have each family member share what they remember about the situation and talk about how they felt before, during, and after. Then ask each person to share a time they've been afraid in the past week. Encourage everyone to think of ways God can help when we're afraid.

Prayer Starter ■■■

What fears do your kids struggle with? Pray that each one will take their fears to Jesus. And pray that God will give your children his peace amid their fears.
