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

God Tests Abraham

Genesis 22:1-18



► Bible Point Obey God.

Key Verse

"So be careful to do what the Lord your God has commanded vou: do not turn aside to the right or to the left. Walk in all the way that the Lord your God has commanded you, so that you may live and prosper and prolong your days in the land that you will possess" (Deuteronomy 5:32-33).

A Preface for Today's Material

This account may seem horrifying if one doesn't study it carefully. It's hard to understand how our good God could command a parent to sacrifice a child. But if we examine the text, we can take comfort in knowing that God never intended for Abraham to sacrifice Isaac. The whole event was designed to test Abraham; it was a chance for him to grow his faith and learn about God's faithfulness.

Abraham Obeys God's Command to Sacrifice His Son

Isaac was the embodiment of all of God's promises to Abraham. However, no matter how surprised or saddened Abraham must have been, Abraham obeyed. The Bible says he set out the very next day. When Abraham knew what God wanted him to do, he set out to do it.

Abraham's faith in God and his willingness to obey are truly amazing. Not only was he willing to sacrifice his son, but he maintained faith in God's promise about Isaac. He said to his servants, "We will come back to you" (Genesis 22:5). Somehow Abraham was confident that in spite of this recent command, God would preserve Isaac, through whom God had promised to make Abraham's descendants as numerous as the stars in the heavens!

Abraham and Isaac Journey to the Place of Sacrifice

It took Abraham and Isaac three days to travel about 50 miles over rough, mountainous terrain. During the trip, Abraham had time to think. Certainly questions flooded his mind: "What if God really does let Isaac die? What will I tell Sarah? Might this God I'm serving abandon me now after all these

promises?" Abraham could easily have iustified disobedience in this case-after all, this was the child God had promised to him and Sarah; maybe the voice he had heard wasn't God's after all. But whatever thoughts went through his mind, Abraham never swerved from his steadfast obedience.

Isaac Also Obeyed God



The Bible tells us nothing of Isaac's

thoughts or feelings during this trip. He must have noticed that his father was behaving strangely. But Isaac showed faith, too. He submitted to being placed on the altar in obedience to God's command.


WEAVING FAITH **INTO FAMILIES**

Obedience requires submission. Find a time when you can be alone. Kneel before God and pray aloud, submitting yourself, your will, and your life to him. Pledge yourself to obey God. Then faithfully do what you know God wants you to. Be especially mindful of God's commands throughout one full day. Ask yourself: How does God want me to drive, do my work, act toward my neighbor, treat my family, handle my finances, and so forth? Even if you would naturally choose to do what God calls you to do, adopt the mind-set that your actions are governed by obedience. Say to yourself frequently, "I will choose to do what pleases God." Talk to God about these things.

Insight for Parents

Does today's Bible passage make you squirm? For any parent, the thought of being asked to sacrifice a child seems absurd. And yet, the God of the universe sacrificed his Son Jesus on our behalf. This radical passage from Genesis foreshadows what God would later choose to do in the New Testament by giving up his only child to save us all. What kind of human parent could sacrifice their child so others might live? This amazing passage from Genesis shows us the amazing heart of God, as well as the amazing heart of Abraham to faithfully obey God at significant cost.

Faith Talk Starter

Share about a time you didn't obey God, and share how you felt during and afterward. Maybe you chose to deliberately disobey God by lying about something at work, or maybe you simply chose to ignore God when he told you to help out a friend. Then share a time you obeyed God, and compare how that felt similar to or different from when you disobeyed. After sharing these personal experiences with your kids, work together to brainstorm ways you can encourage one another to obey God in the future.

Prayer Starter

This week as you consider prayers focused on obedience, be sure to start with your own prayer to be a more obedient follower of God. As you reflect on your own beautiful children, thank God for the ways your children have been obedient to God and to their parents. Then list those specific ways your kids need more of God's help in order to obey.
