BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

## God Cares for His People

As the mass of more than 2 million Hebrews left Egypt, God knew that facing the warlike Philistines immediately would likely have made the Hebrews lose hope and turn back to Egypt. The pillar of cloud by day and pillar of fire by night must have been awesome and comforting.

## God's Unusual Strategy

God instructed the Israelites to turn back somewhat toward Egypt and camp at a spot between Migdol and the Red Sea. God had a bigger plan than anyone else could know. Pharaoh would have been confident that he could easily defeat the Israelites.

The Israelites were slaves of the Egyptians only days prior to this event. They'd been beaten by the whips of the slave drivers and were familiar with the weapons the Egyptians carried. They must have realized that their fighting talents were nothing compared with the Egyptians'. And they were backed against the sea with mountains on two sides and the Egyptians bearing down on them. The situation must have seemed hopeless.

#### **God Shows His Power**

We can realize that God had all this planned. He knew that the people would be frightened. He knew that they would doubt him. But he also knew that his power would be remembered forever. God knew that he would prevail, that the Hebrews would be saved from Pharaoh, and that the result would be a people growing greatly in their faith in him.

It may seem odd that no record of this event has been found in Egyptian history. However, it's likely that all records were wiped from the books because it would have been an embarrassment for the world to know that mighty Egypt had been devastated by its own lowly slaves.

## The Jesus Connection

We live in troubled times when it's easy for people to lose heart and feel hopeless and lost. But a relationship with Jesus can give us peace and joy. Jesus is our light in dark times.

When have you felt out of sorts and desperate to find some control over your situation? Perhaps the Israelites felt these things after they escaped from Egypt. Although they may not have recognized it at the time, eventually they were able to look back and see how God used that time to protect them and bring glory to himself.

What part of your life might God have his hand in now? What can you do to connect with God during

times of fear and desperation? Take a few minutes to reflect on God's hand in your life. Write your reflection here.

### Naming Our Fears

#### What You'll Do

Greet parents warmly as they gather. Have them form groups of five or six with other parents who have kids the same age as theirs.

Say: Take a few minutes to share with one another about how your week went with your kids.

Allow time for sharing.

Say: In your groups, take a few minutes to briefly share stories about a time when you were really afraid.

After about five minutes, ask someone from each group to briefly share one of the stories with the entire group.

Say: Now, in your groups, discuss Questions 1 and 2 in your FaithWeaver NOW Parent Handbooks. We'll gather back together in five minutes.

#### **QUESTION 1**

What, if anything, consistently scares each of your kids?

#### QUESTION 2

When your kids are scared, what tends to help them, and why?

Bring everyone back together after five minutes, and have parents share highlights and insights from the discussion time.

Say: Today we'll learn about the Israelites crossing the Red Sea. We'll see what a very scary situation they were in, and how God helped them when they were afraid.

#### God's Deliverance

#### What You'll Do

Have parents combine groups until there are only three groups based on the ages of people's children: one for parents of preschoolers, one for parents of elementary school children, and one for parents of teenagers.

Make sure each group has a few Bibles, a sheet of poster board, and markers.

Say: In your group, read together the Bible passage that I assign you. Pay attention to all the things the people of Israel had to fear in that passage, and also how God delivered them. God's deliverance might be related to something in previous verses, but you can still make note of it. Make your notes on the poster board. Then be prepared to present your findings to everyone. You'll have about 10 minutes.

Assign each group one of the following passages:

- Group 1: Exodus 13:17–14:4
- Group 2: Exodus 14:5-20
- Group 3: Exodus 14:21-31

After about 10 minutes, call everyone back together. Have a representative from each group present its findings to the entire group.

Say: Next, in your groups, discuss Questions 3 and 4 in your handbooks. We'll get back together in about five minutes.

#### QUESTION 3

When have you experienced God's deliverance when you were afraid? What did God do, and how did it ease your fears?

#### QUESTION 4

What makes it easy—or difficult—for you and your kids to trust God for help when you're afraid? Explain.

Bring everyone back together after five minutes, and have parents share highlights and insights from the discussion time.

Say: We've seen from these Bible passages that God helped the Israelites when they had much to fear. God didn't provide deliverance just during Bible times, though. ▶ GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too. Let's explore some more what that means for our families.





### Remembering the Blessings

#### What You'll Do

Make sure everyone has a Bible.

Say: This week our children are learning Psalm 23:3-4 as their Key Verse. Let's look at that verse together.

Read aloud this week's Key Verse, Psalm 23:3-4, while parents follow along in their own Bibles: "He restores my soul. He guides me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me" (Psalm 23:3-4).

Invite parents to comment on how this verse speaks to them about God's help when they're afraid.

Form groups of four to six, still based on the ages of parents' children.

Say: Now, in your groups, discuss Questions 5 through 8 in your handbooks. We'll gather back together in 12 minutes.

#### **QUESTION 5**

What fear (or fears) is your family currently facing?

#### QUESTION 6

What do you think it means when God doesn't deliver us out of a scary situation?

#### QUESTION 7


When your family faces fears, what role does—or can—prayer play?

#### QUESTION 8

How can you help your kids take their fears to Jesus?

Bring everyone back together after 12 minutes, and have parents share highlights and insights from the discussion time with everyone.

Say: Today we've seen that God helped the people of Israel when they were in a very scary situation, and that ▶ GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too. Throughout the Old Testament, whenever God addresses his people, he says to them, "I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt." God reminds his people again and again how he rescued them from that terrible situation. That's an important and powerful reminder for us and our families, too.

### **Daily Challenge**

#### What You'll Do

Say: Today we learned that DOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID. Your Daily Challenge this week is to create a poster with your family that celebrates the ways you've already seen God at work, rescuing and caring for you, helping you when you've been afraid. Each family member can participate. You might use as a title, "I am the Lord your God who...." Leave room on your poster to document future times when God will help you. Take a few minutes to talk to a partner about what this challenge might look like in daily life. Be as specific as you can about how you'll create this reminder of God's help when we're afraid. Allow time.

Close your time together in prayer. Invite parents to contribute short prayers, thanking God for his help when they face fears. When everyone seems to be wrapping up, close the prayer.

Say: Your kids should have a take-home page from this week's lesson to show you. It has their Daily Challenges for this week and ideas for weaving faith at home as a family. Please help your kids follow through with their Daily Challenges. WEEK 6	The Israelites Worship a Golden Calf (Exodus 32:1-25)	"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:2-3).	Only God deserves our worship.
WEEK 7	The Israelites Build the Tabernacle (Exodus 35:4–36:38)	"And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:17).	We all can serve God.
WEEK 8	Moses Sends Spies Into the Promised Land (Numbers 13:1–14:23)	"Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58).	Be brave for God.
