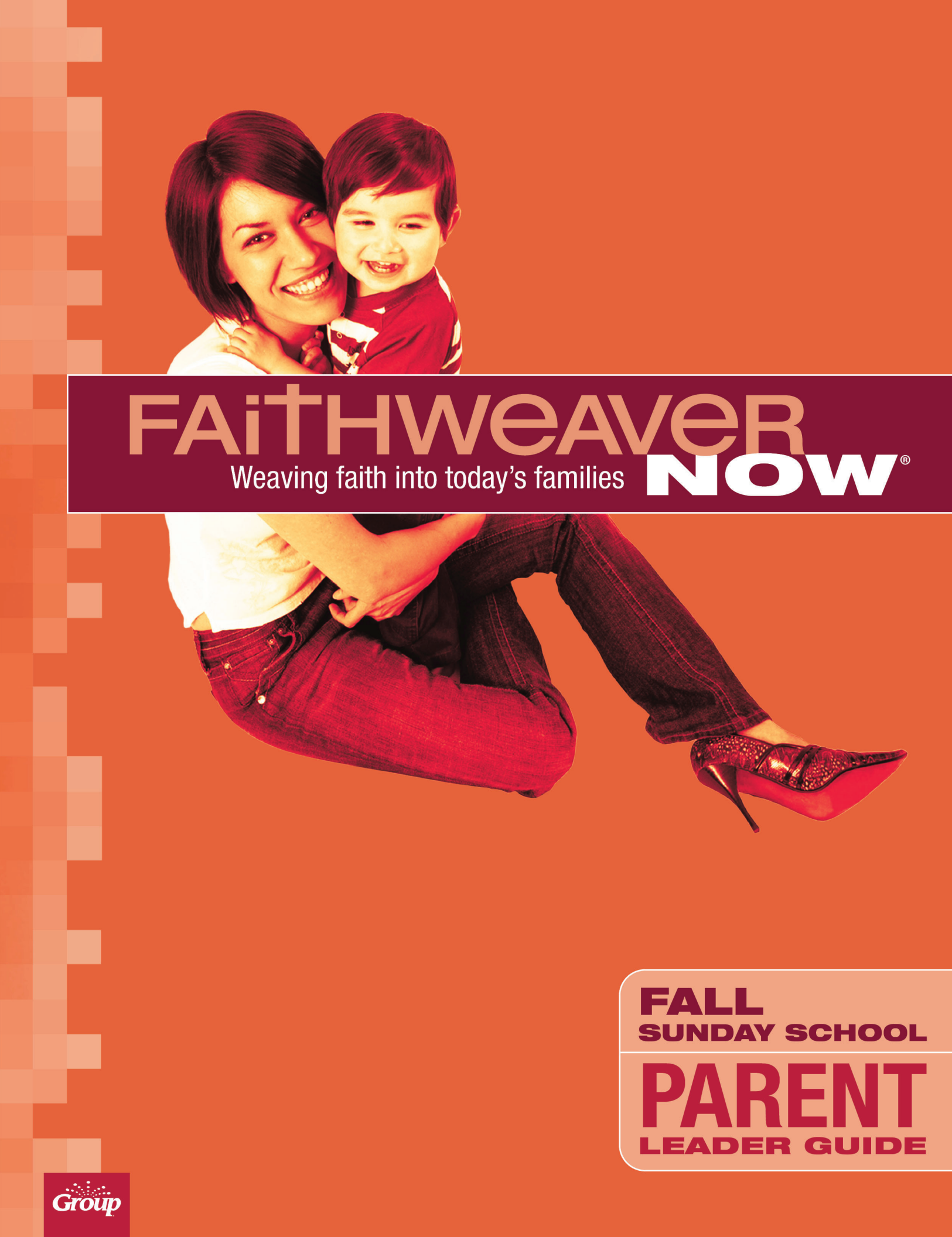

God Creates the World

Genesis 1:1–2:3

BIBLE BACKGROUND
FOR LEADERS

God's Beginnings With Humans

The book of Genesis gives us the beginnings. Not the beginning of God; God has existed eternally. Nor is it just the beginning of our world. It's the beginnings of God's working with humans. In fact, "beginning" is the meaning of the Greek word from which the name *Genesis* came. What better place to start a new season than at the beginning!

Elohim is the Hebrew name used for God in Genesis 1:1. It's interesting that the name is plural, but the verb *created* is singular. Even though God exists in three persons, the action of creating the universe was unified.

God's Creation Was Good

Genesis 1:1–2:3 describes a vast variety of things God created, but the focus isn't so much on the creation as it is on the Creator. Nine times in this passage we read "God said" and then some variation of "and it was so." God spoke our universe, our planet, and humankind into existence. And what God did was good.

The word translated “good” here is a common Hebrew word that, like our word *good*, can have several meanings. Here, it likely has no moral connotation but means “just as it should be.” God looked at what he had done and knew it was right.

After Creating, God Rested

God was creating a bountiful, beautiful home for the treasured beings that he created last. Notice that God created many of each thing: not just one tree, but “seed-bearing plants and trees...according to their various kinds”; not just one star, but “lights in the expanse of the sky”; not just one fish, but “every living and moving thing with which the water teems.” God

prepared a marvelous earth for his crowning creation to enjoy. And then God created humans. We're a vital part of everything good that God made.

When God finished creating the heavens and the earth “in all their vast array,” he rested. Why? God wasn’t tired. God didn’t need to rest. No, God rested as a signal that Creation was complete. The seventh day became a holy day—a day to reflect on the wonder of what God had done, a day to smile and to know that it was good.

The Jesus Connection

God's creation is inspiring, and the gift of his Son is lifesaving. Thank God for the beauty of life in nature and in our hearts through a relationship with Jesus! Show love for God's creation during the lesson this week, and help others see that the Creator has given them new life through Jesus as well.

What in nature amazes you? Oceans of beautifully colored fish? Massive forests? Take some time to appreciate the creativity of God's design, and consider how God has designed your life, too. You can write your prayer here.

God's Amazing Creation



Tip If your group can meet outside, take advantage of a natural setting for this week's lesson because it will enhance the conversations about God's wonderful creation. If you can't meet outdoors, do whatever you can to improve the "natural" feel of your meeting area, such as bringing plants into the room, opening the windows to draw in fresh air, or playing music with nature sounds quietly in the background.

What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Greet parents warmly as they gather.

Ask participants to share with each other how their week went with their kids.

Invite parents to each select one item from the box you brought from home—but don't explain the purpose behind the items or how they'll be used. If you were unable to gather the items, have parents pick something (such as a picture, the lights, a chair, the carpet color) in your meeting area.

Ask parents to form groups of three or four.

Say: **I've asked each of you to select one item from the box, but I didn't explain how you were going to use the item. In your groups, discuss all the ways your individual items remind you of God's creation and God's creativity. You're free to talk about the item you chose plus the items selected by the other people in your group. You'll have about five minutes for this exercise.**

Allow five minutes for discussion. Then gather everyone's attention.

Say: **Okay, let's go around the room and share some of the ideas you generated.**

Allow about five minutes for people to share their ideas.

With everyone still in the smaller groups, ask participants to discuss Questions 1 and 2 in their FaithWeaver NOW Parent Handbooks. Explain that they'll have about five minutes to talk about these questions.

QUESTION 1

Consider a recent experience when God's creation amazed or overwhelmed you. What caused that response, and how did the experience affect you?

QUESTION 2

Now consider your kids and God's creation. When have they expressed amazement about something they've noticed in God's creation?

Allow about five minutes for conversation. Regain everyone's attention, and ask for insights from the discussion.

Say: **We're surrounded by the evidence of God's creativity. Each person in this room is a wonderful part of God's creation. So are towering mountains, delicate flowers, stars spinning in distant solar systems, and waves lapping the shores of great oceans. ► GOD MADE THE WORLD, and God sustains it all. But how did God do it? And what can we teach our kids about God's character through creation? Let's begin by looking at the opening pages of the Bible, in the book of Genesis.**

BIBLE EXPLORATION

Day by Day

What You'll Do

Ask parents to form seven groups—a group can be as small as one person. Assign each group a number from one to seven. Distribute Bibles, if needed. Ask groups to read these verses together.

Group 1: Genesis 1:1-5

Group 2: Genesis 1:6-8

Group 3: Genesis 1:9-13

Group 4: Genesis 1:14-19

Group 5: Genesis 1:20-23

Group 6: Genesis 1:24-31

Group 7: Genesis 2:1-3

Allow time for groups to finish their readings.

Say: **In your groups, identify what God created on the day that corresponds with your group number—and how God did it. Also share how the things God created that day impact your role as a parent. If you're a group of one, get with another group to talk.**

Wait a few minutes until groups have reached their conclusions. Then ask participants to discuss Questions 3 and 4 in their handbooks.

**QUESTION 3**

What aspects of God's creation do your kids seem to appreciate the most, and why? What would your family miss out on if your assigned day of creation hadn't occurred?

QUESTION 4

What have been some ways you've taught your kids about God's creation and God's incredible creativity?

Give groups five minutes to discuss the questions, and then regain their attention. Ask several people to share insights and ideas from Question 4, and allow time for parents to write ideas they may want to use in the "Notes" section of their handbooks.

Say: **As parents, we have the primary responsibility for teaching and instructing our kids about who God is and how much God loves and values all creation.**

► **GOD MADE THE WORLD.** Creation and God's creativity are important reflections of God's design and purpose for our lives—and for your children's lives. Let's spend a few minutes seeing how we can help our kids connect God's creation of the universe and the creativity he's given them.

Value as God's Creations

What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Say: **Our children are God's purposeful creations. Jesus died to save people—including the children we love and care for. And as creations Jesus died to save, people have the highest value of anything in creation. One of the many gifts that God our Creator blesses us with is creativity.**

Have each group discuss Questions 5 through 7 in their handbooks.

QUESTION 5

As our kids get older, how can we help them maintain the sense of wonder and awe they feel about God's incredible power?

QUESTION 6

What aspects of creativity do you see emerging in each of your kids? What are some specific ways you try to nurture that creativity?

QUESTION 7

How can we use the Creation account as an opportunity to encourage our kids to pursue their unique paths of creativity?





Allow about 10 minutes. Then gather everyone back together and ask participants to share some insights from their discussions with the whole group.

Say: **We want to always have a sense of awe and wonder at how incredible God is, just as young children do. ► GOD MADE THE WORLD, and because we're made in his image, we can reflect his creativity. It's important to see ourselves as creative people, discovering and developing all of our individual creative areas. As parents, we have the opportunity to encourage that same growth in our children's lives.**

4 LASTING IMPRESSIONS

Daily Challenge

What You'll Do ■■■■■■

Say: **This week, help your kids remember that ► GOD MADE THE WORLD. Your Daily Challenge this week is to find a new way to enjoy God's creation with your family. Take a few minutes to talk to a partner about what this challenge might look like in daily life. Be as specific as you can about how you'll appreciate what God made. Allow time.**

Say: **Please join me in prayer.**

Pray: **Dear God, thank you for the amazing world you created. Please help our kids understand that you created the universe, that you love each of your creations, and that you designed us to be wonderfully creative people. Show us new ways to enjoy and appreciate with our children what you made. In Jesus' name, amen.**

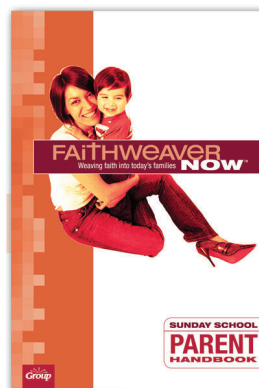

WEEK 3	Adam and Eve Sin (Genesis 3)	"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).	God doesn't want us to sin.
WEEK 4	Cain Kills Abel (Genesis 4:1-16)	"Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves" (Romans 12:10).	God wants us to love our families.
WEEK 5	Noah Builds the Ark (Genesis 6:5-22)	"Peter and the other apostles replied: 'We must obey God rather than men!'" (Acts 5:29).	God wants us to obey.
WEEK 6	God Floods the Earth (Genesis 7-8; 9:8-16)	"The Lord is faithful to all his promises and loving toward all he has made" (Psalm 145:13).	We can count on God's promises.
WEEK 7	People Build a Tower at Babel (Genesis 11:1-9)	"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5).	We put God first.
WEEK 8	Abram Follows God's Direction (Genesis 12:1-8)	"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:5-6).	We can always trust God.
WEEK 9	Lot and Abram Divide the Land (Genesis 13)	"Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31).	God wants us to put others first.
WEEK 10	God Makes a Covenant With Abram (Genesis 15:1-18)	"'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future'" (Jeremiah 29:11).	God has good plans for us.
WEEK 11	Abraham's Visitors/ Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 18:1-19:29)	"For nothing is impossible with God" (Luke 1:37).	God does amazing things.
WEEK 12	Isaac Is Born (Genesis 21:1-6)	"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4).	Thank God for his gifts.
WEEK 13	God Cares for Hagar and Ishmael (Genesis 21:8-21)	"So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9).	God always hears us when we pray.
