Jesus Teaches About Commitment

Mark 8:31-38



Jesus Rebuked Peter

The disciples were likely counting on a great earthly kingdom in which Jesus would lead the Jews in overthrowing the Romans and would place his disciples in important positions. Jesus' statements didn't go along with those expectations! Peter wanted Jesus to change his mind and forget all this talk about dying.

Peter's thinking was based on wrong assumptions because he saw things from a purely human point of view. Here we see a clear statement about what it means to follow Jesus. Too often we think of God as a powerful being who can help us advance our own agendas. Instead, truly following Jesus means listening to what he says, discovering his will for our lives, and then obediently following, no matter how attractive or repulsive that may seem to us at the time.

Jesus Challenged the Crowd

A crowd had apparently gathered to hear Jesus, and he wanted to clarify his meaning. This is not a description of what some call "easy believism." Instead, Jesus points out how denying oneself means turning away from selfish, self-protective attitudes and seeking the true humility and faith God wants to see in us.

What does it mean to take up your cross? For Jesus' disciples to each take up his own cross didn't mean just to endure suffering. It meant to accept fully the suffering they would face because of their faith in Christ. Jesus wanted his disciples to know that their faith came with a cost.

Stand Firm in Faith

As he spoke of what it means to follow him, Jesus knew that many in the crowd around him wouldn't

 be followers he would recognize as his own when he returns. Our generation is much like that of Jesus' day. People who claim to be religious—or even Christian often shy away from bold witnessing for Jesus. It's easy to say you believe in God, but it's much more difficult to confess you're a Jesus-following Christian.

The Jesus Connection

Humans are willing to sacrifice a lot for the sake of those they love. Your relationship with Jesus *will* require sacrifice, risk, and loyal commitment—but it's all worth it!

How can you take up your cross? Try living out the "Joy" acronym: Pray about one specific way you'll put *Jesus* first (such as spending time with him first thing each day), put *others* second (such as washing a friend's car), and put *yourself* last (such as giving up time watching TV in order to help someone else). You can write your prayer here.





Create-a-Story

What You'll Do

Greet parents warmly as they gather. Ask them to turn to a partner and share how their week went with their kids.

After allowing a few minutes for discussion, have parents form four groups. Give each group a set of word cards, two blank cards, a pen or pencil, and a roll of tape.

Say: As a group, create a short story that incorporates the words on your cards. You also have a couple of blank cards you can use to include additional words in your story. Once you've created your tale, tape the cards on the wall in the order you're using them.

Give groups about seven minutes to create their stories, and then have them present their stories to the rest of the group. Allow about five minutes for the presentations.

Ask parents to discuss Questions 1 and 2 in their FaithWeaver NOW Parent Handbooks.



QUESTION 1

Although these stories used mostly the same words, what differences existed among them?

QUESTION 2

What are some benefits of having choices? What would life be like if we all did the exact same thing?

Allow several minutes for discussion. Then ask a few parents to share their responses to the questions.

Say: In this activity, each group made unique choices that shaped the stories. You arranged the cards in different ways to spin your tales. When it comes to faith, you also make choices about your commitment to following Jesus. Certain choices strengthen commitment, while others weaken it. Jesus calls each of us to understand that following him takes commitment. As parents, it's our privilege and responsibility to help our kids ► COMMIT TO FOLLOW JESUS. Today we'll explore a Bible passage where Jesus teaches about the commitment we make to him.

Responding to Pressure

What You'll Do

Form groups of three, preferably three people of the same gender. Explain that you'd like everyone to stand while you read some Scripture verses. Have two members of each group stand about 6 feet apart, facing each other; these are the Outsiders. Have the third person—the Insider—stand between the Outsiders.

Read Mark 8:31-33.

Say: If you're an Outsider, please take one step forward.

Read Mark 8:34-35.

Say: Outsiders, please step forward again.

Read Mark 8:36-37.

Say: One more time, Outsiders: Step even closer to your Insider.

Read Mark 8:38. Then have trios find seats and answer Questions 3 through 5 in their handbooks.

QUESTION 3

Insiders, what was it like to stand still while the Outsiders kept moving closer and closer?

QUESTION 4

What are some ways that life's pressures—especially as a parent—test your commitment to follow Jesus? What pressures are your kids facing that might test their commitment to follow Jesus?

QUESTION 5

According to Mark 8:31-38, why is it necessary to help our kids understand and appreciate the kind of commitment it takes to be a fully devoted follower of Jesus?

Allow about 10 minutes of conversation. Then ask someone from each trio to share their responses with the entire group.

Say: All the pressures and challenges we face as parents can put our commitment to follow Jesus to the test. When it feels as if the world is closing in on us, we can become intimidated and frightened. But Jesus gives us the strength to

take a stand, pick up our cross, and follow him-even when there are tough consequences. And he promises to do the same thing for our kids. Let's explore some practical ideas for helping them COMMIT TO FOLLOW JESUS in all circumstances.

What You'll Do

Ask parents to form new trios. Distribute Bibles, if needed.

Say: Please read this week's Key Verse, Romans 1:16, and then discuss Questions 6 through 9 in your handbooks. You'll have about eight minutes.

QUESTION 6

When members of a family aren't ashamed of Jesus and aren't afraid of following him, how might they interact differently with one another? How might they interact differently with people outside their family?

QUESTION 7

In what ways does following Jesus display the power of God at work?

QUESTION 8

How might Romans 1:16 become a prayer or theme verse for your family?



QUESTION 9

What causes, activities, or hobbies are your kids committed to already? How might you use those commitments to teach your kids more about what it means to commit to following Jesus?

After about eight minutes, gather trios back together and ask them to share some insights from their discussions with the whole group.

Say: Following Jesus requires commitment. At times, Satan and life's circumstances challenge and test our faith. As parents, we have the opportunity to help our kids discover what it means to stand firm in our faith and COMMIT TO FOLLOW JESUS. We can do that without being ashamed, thanks to God's power at work within us.

Please find a partner who you haven't been in a group with yet today. Then take turns praying for each of your kids. Ask Jesus to give you strength and courage as you lead a life of commitment to Jesus and to help your kids follow the same path. We'll come back together in about five minutes.

4 LASTING

Daily Challenge

What You'll Do

Say: Today we learned why it's important to ► COMMIT TO FOLLOW JESUS—and to help our kids do so, too. Your Daily Challenge this week is to come up with three creative ways to remind your family members to stay committed to Jesus. Take a few minutes to talk to a partner about what this challenge might look like in daily life. Be as specific as you can about how you'll encourage one another to commit to following Jesus. Allow time.

Say: Let's close in prayer.

Ask parents to stand in a circle and join hands with one another.

Say: Let's go around the circle and each say one word related to commitment or following Jesus. Say your word as a prayer to Jesus as you encourage your kids to follow him. I'll start.

When everyone's finished, close the prayer.
