BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

#### Jesus Compares Trees to Authentic Faith

In his references to good and bad trees in this passage, Jesus is obviously drawing an analogy to the fruit that people bear. Notice that the distinction is not between healthy apple trees and diseased apple trees. It is between fruit trees and thorns or briers; it is the kind of tree that makes the difference. Many kinds of trees look good but don't produce fruit. So it is with people. Jesus seems to be saying that a person who is not really a servant of God, no matter how good he or she seems to be, cannot possibly produce fruit for him. Conversely, someone who really is God's servant will automatically produce fruit.

#### The Heart Is Known Through Actions

•••••

Then in Luke 6:45, Jesus expounds on the principle he introduced in the tree metaphor. What comes out of us through our speech and behavior flows from what is within. If what is inside us is good and God-honoring, our lives will honor God. If what is inside us is evil, our lives will not honor God. No matter how hard we try to make good impressions, no one will be fooled for long if our hearts are deceitful.

#### **The Jesus Connection**

As we make our relationship with Jesus a priority, we'll find our actions will bear fruit that will please him.

Read aloud Luke 6:43-45. What can you do to store good things in your heart? In what circumstances can you bring good things out of the good you've stored in your heart? If you passionately follow God, the good you've stored will flow out to a needy world. Ask God to show you someone in your church who has a need. And then do the good thing and help that person.

#### Living the Call

#### What You'll Do

Greet parents warmly as they gather.

Say: What's your child's favorite fruit? Form a group of four with others whose kids share your kids' favorite fruit, and then discuss how your week went with your kids.

As parents chat, make sure each group has something to write with.

Say: Choose a scribe for your group, and have this person turn to the Notes section in the FaithWeaver NOW Parent Handbook. Then work as a group to brainstorm a list of types of people who live out their calling; for example, "actors act," "plumbers plumb," or "lawyers litigate." You have two minutes to brainstorm.

After two minutes, invite groups to each share one thing from their lists. Go around the room, asking groups not to duplicate answers.

Say: All right, so fill in the blank: "Christians...." Invite parents to call out suggestions.

Say: Some people think of faith as just "fire insurance" and may not be concerned about acting on their beliefs. But faithfully following Jesus and acting according to his teachings is the way to point others to God. ▶ ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS.

Direct groups to discuss Questions 1 and 2 in their handbooks.

#### Good Tree, Good Fruit

#### What You'll Do

Say: Though today's lesson focuses on just a few verses, they are powerful words from Jesus. With your group, read Luke 6:43-45 and share your initial reaction to what Jesus says. Then turn to the Notes section in your handbook and illustrate this passage with as much detail as possible to anticipate any questions your children might have about Jesus' meaning. You need only one drawing per group, though others may draw if they'd like.

Allow about five minutes for parents to read, draw, and talk before asking them to take about seven minutes to discuss Questions 3 through 5 in their handbooks.

#### QUESTION 3

What's the difference between doing good deeds and what Jesus is saying in Luke 6:43-45?

#### QUESTION 4

Name examples of people you know who are "good trees bearing good fruit." What do you admire about them?

#### QUESTION 5

Imagine you're not a Christian and are observing our church. How would you characterize our fruit?

After seven minutes, invite groups to share their drawings as well as highlights from their discussion.

#### Shine Supplies

#### What You'll Do

Give each group a flashlight, and do what you can to completely darken your meeting space—cover windows, turn off the lights in the room, and so on. Invite groups to move around and play with their flashlights, making shadow figures on the wall.

After a few minutes, bring everyone back together.

Say: In today's Key Verse, Jesus uses a different metaphor to convey the same idea. Use your flashlight to read Matthew 5:16, and then discuss Questions 6 through 8 in your handbooks.



#### QUESTION 6

Is the point of shining your light—or bearing good fruit—so that others will know you're a Christian or so that they'll see God? What's the difference?

#### QUESTION 7

If you asked your kids, how would they say they see your light?

#### QUESTION 8

What shadows might get in the way of your light?

Say: It's not always easy to follow Jesus and shine your light. Sometimes we doubt; sometimes we just don't want to do the right thing. And if it can be tough for us, you know it's also tough for your kids. Flip to the Notes section of your handbook and brainstorm with your group practical ways to "boost your wattage"; for example, spending time in prayer (When? Where? Be specific!) or asking God to help you end a "rotten fruit" habit. Keep your kids in mind, too—how can you help them boost their wattage? You have five minutes to work.

When time's up, ask a few people to share some of their ideas.

Say: Turn to a partner and share what fruit you already see in your kids' lives and what you might do this week to encourage them in faith and good deeds. Take about one minute each to share.

After two minutes, gather everyone's attention.

Say: Let's end today with some delicious affirmation. Think about something you do because of Jesus. For example, because I follow Jesus and want to help others grow in faith, I teach Sunday school. I pray that my teaching is a good fruit that points others to Jesus! Pause while parents consider what they do.

Say: Now please stand with me in a circle, and let's take turns filling in the blank: "Because I follow Jesus, I produce fruit when I...."

When everyone has shared, thank God for his gracious invitation into faith and a lifestyle of living out the faith to which he's called us. Then pass around the fruit for everyone to enjoy.





#### **Daily Challenge**

#### What You'll Do

Say: Today we learned that ACTING LIKE JESUS SHOWS WE'RE CHRISTIANS. Your Daily Challenge this week as a family is to agree on one way each day to act like Jesus. Take a few minutes to talk to a partner about what this challenge might look like in daily life. Be as specific as you can about how your family can act like Jesus. Allow time.

Close your time together in prayer.

Say: Your kids should have a take-home page from this week's lesson to show you. It has their Daily Challenges for this week and ideas for weaving faith at home as a family. Please help your kids follow through with their Daily Challenges. WEEK 7	Saul Meets Jesus Near Damascus (Acts 9:1-20)	"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17).	Jesus changes our lives.
WEEK 8	Peter Raises Tabitha From the Dead (Acts 9:36-43)	"The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective" (James 5:16).	God answers when we pray.
WEEK 9	An Angel Frees Peter From Jail (Acts 12:1-18)	"For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways" (Psalm 91:11).	Angels protect and help God's people.
WEEK 10	Lydia Is Converted (Acts 16:9-15)	"Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season" (2 Timothy 4:2).	Be prepared to tell others about Jesus.
WEEK 11	Paul's Jailer Believes in Jesus (Acts 16:16-34)	"They replied, 'Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved'" (Acts 16:31).	Jesus saves us.


