# Prophets Foretell SCSUS COMPTO Jeremiah 33:14-16



**Instructions:** Give kids birdseed, glue, and markers. Point out that the seeds can grow into plants. Instruct kids to glue the seeds below the ground, and then let them use the markers to draw the promised plants growing above the ground. Remind kids that God keeps his promises, (For additional instructions, see the Teacher Guide.)

### Here's a fun way to remind your child


that God keeps his promises. Face your child and repeat this poem with him or her.

God promises to be with you (point to partner),
And God promises to be with me. (Point to self.)
He keeps all his promises. (Link arms.)

So we can trust God and his promises. (Face each other and hold hands.)

**ASK** @ Tell about a promise you're glad God kept.

### What I Learned Today ...

Bible Time: Jeremiah 33:14-16 tells us that
God keeps his promises. Today your child learned
about how God told a prophet named Jeremiah
that Jesus would be born. Then even though God's
people had to wait for Jesus, they saw that God
keeps his promises.

**Key Verse:** Jesus is born to us (adapted from Isaiah 9:6).





This week, your child learned that God keeps his promises. Your child committed to one of the following challenges to

remember that he or she can tell others about the most important promise that God kept. Help your child weave faith into life this week and follow through on the challenge!

- 1. Make up and sing a song to your brother or sister about God's promises.
- When you wake up, think of one promise to you that God kept. Thank him for it and remember it as you get ready for your day.
- 3. Make a promise to help your parents around the house. When you do what you promised, thank God for keeping his promises to you.



### To help your child create this snack surprise

you'll need popcorn, 1 cup M $\xi$ M's, and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup raisins. Pop a medium bowl of popcorn. Wait until it cools, and then throw away any unpopped kernels. Let your child add the M $\xi$ M's and raisins, and stir the mixture.

As you enjoy your snack together, point out to your child that even though the popcorn hides the candy, we know that the candy is there. The same is true with God. We know God keeps his promises even when we have to wait for them.

- **ASK** © Could you still see the candies after you mixed them into the popcorn? Why or why not?
  - Explain how that's like trusting God's promises, even if you can't see them.
