Instructions: Help children cut out the boxes at the bottom of the page and match the numbers to the pictures above. Then have them use glue sticks to apply glue along the edges as marked on the back and attach the flap. When the page is finished, talk about what happened in Genesis 1 so children can turn the flaps at the appropriate times. (For additional instructions, see the Teacher Guide.)

What I Learned Today...

Bible Time

Simplifying how God created the world for a preschooler doesn't need to be an overwhelming task. It simply means pausing long enough to point out the natural things God created—from trees, sky, and flowers to animals and people—that exist around you. Take a few moments each day to encourage your child to look around and describe what he or she sees, feels, smells, hears, and tastes. To reinforce that God made the world, you may want to reread the creation page (on the reverse) with your child every day this week.

Key Verse: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1).



Take a walk with your child through a nearby park to experience firsthand some of the things God created. Collect items in a lunch bag so that you

can inspect them under a magnifying glass when you return home. Point out the sky, clouds, dirt, plants, bugs, and animals, and remind your child that God created them all. Look for the different colors God made, and collect different kinds of leaves. Marvel at the differences. Remind your child that God created all these things for us to take care of and enjoy.



Soak an old washcloth in water, and place it in a shallow pie plate. (You might want

to cut the washcloth in the shape of your child's favorite animal first.) Soak a small handful of grass seeds in lukewarm water for an hour. Have your child sprinkle the grass seeds all over the washcloth, and then put the plate in front of a sunny window. Each day, have your child give the washcloth a few squirts of water with a spray bottle. In three to five days, the grass should appear. Once a week you may want to help your child cut the grass pet's growth.



This week, your child learned that God made everything. He or she committed to one of the following challenges to thank

God for his creation. Help your child weave faith into life this week and follow through on the challenge!

- Ask your mom or dad to take you on a walk outside. Show each other the beautiful things you see that God made.
- Collect some leaves or flowers from your yard, and glue them to a piece of paper. Hang the paper in your room to remind you of God's beautiful creation.
- Find a book about animals or plants in your house, or ask a parent to take you to the library. Thank God for making such a wonderful world.
