# What I Learned Today...

Bible Time: Abraham wanted a son for a very long time. He was so happy when God finally gave him a baby boy. In Genesis 22:1-18, God asked Abraham to do a very hard thing. He said, "Abraham, if you really love me, give me back Isaac." God asked Abraham to offer his son, Isaac, as a sacrifice. Abraham was willing to give to God the thing he loved the most, his one and only son. God rewarded Abraham's obedience by sending an animal for the sacrifice instead of Isaac. This week, talk with your child about being obedient to God even when it's hard. Praise your child each time he or she is obedient to you.

Key Verse: Ask God for wisdom (adapted from James 1:5).



## This week, your child learned that our

obedience pleases God. Your child committed to one of the following challenges to remember that he or she needs to be obedient even when it is hard. Help your child weave faith into life this week and follow through on the challenge!

- Share a toy with a friend, and then tell how Abraham obeyed God by giving up Isaac.
- Obey God by doing the thing you committed to on the front of the My Bible Hugs page.



Follow the LEADER

Take a family walk together, and choose one person to be the leader. The leader directs the rest of the family in actions such as singing a song, humming, clapping, running, skip-


ping, or hopping. Let everyone have a turn to be the leader.


