

# Prophets Foretell Jesus' Coming

Luke 1:26-45; 2:1-20 Jeremiah 33:14-16



**Instructions:** Give kids each a pencil, and set out glue and glitter to share. Have kids each draw trumpet shapes in the people's hands. Then have them fill in the trumpet shapes with glue and sprinkle glitter over the glue. Remind your children that many people told of God's promise to send Jesus and we can, too. (For additional classroom instructions, see Teacher Guide.)



### What I learned today ...

**Bible Time:** Jeremiah 33:14–16 tells us that God keeps his promises. We learned that God's leaders began whispering about Jesus' birth many years before it actually happened. God kept his promise by sending Jesus to be born as a baby in Bethlehem. We know God was faithful to keep that promise and he keeps promises made to us today as well.

**Key Verse:** To us Jesus is born (adapted from Isaiah 9:6).



## Take an evening walk with your child

in the neighborhood. Have your child look for all the candles in windows and lights on trees. Talk about how people put candles in windows to welcome someone to their home.

- **ASK** @ Who do we welcome into our home at Christmas?
  - Why did baby Jesus come to earth?



### Play Hide-and-Seek with your child. Have your

child hide in different rooms and in different areas inside your home. When your child has found a hiding place, have him or her call out to you. After the call is made, say, "Here I am, I am with you," then find your child and share a big hug together.


- **ASK** @ What were you thinking when you were all alone?
  - @ How about when I answered your call?
  - @ How do you know God was with you?



**This week your child learned** that God keeps his promises. Your child committed to one of the following challenges to share God's promises with others. Help your child weave faith into life this week and follow through on the challenge!

- Use the cup phone you made today to tell a friend about how God kept his promise through Jesus.
- Every time you see a nativity, tell someone near you that God keeps his promises.


