Jesus Teaches About Good Fruit

Luke 6:43-45

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Jesus Compares Trees to Authentic Faith

In his references to good and bad trees in this passage, Jesus is obviously drawing an analogy to the fruit that people bear. Notice that the distinction is not between healthy apple trees and diseased apple trees. It is between fruit trees and thorns or briers; it is the kind of tree that makes the difference. Many kinds of trees look good but don't produce fruit. So it is with people. Jesus seems to be saying that a person who is not really a servant of God, no matter how good he or she seems to be, cannot possibly produce fruit for him. Conversely, someone who really is God's servant will automatically produce fruit.

The Heart Is Known Through Actions

Then in Luke 6:45, Jesus expounds on the principle he introduced in the tree metaphor. What comes out of us through our speech and behavior flows from what is within. If what is inside us is good and God-honoring, our lives will honor God. If what is inside us is evil, our lives will not honor God. No matter how hard we try to make good impressions, no one will be fooled for long if our hearts are deceitful.

The Jesus Connection

As we make our relationship with Jesus a priority, we'll find our actions will bear fruit that will please him.

Read aloud Luke 6:43-45. What can you do to store good things in your heart? In what circumstances can you bring good things out of the good you've stored in your heart? If you passionately follow God, the good you've stored will flow out to a needy world. Ask God to show you someone in your church who has a need. And then do the good thing and help that person.

Consistently use the same signal to announce a transition to the next activity. You could flip the lights off and on, use a train whistle, have a puppet rustling inside a bag, or sing cleanup songs. Keep it simple, consistent, and fun.

What You'll Do

As the children arrive, greet each one with a smile. When it's time to begin, use your whistle to gather the children together in a circle on the floor.

Lead children in singing "Jesus Welcomes Everyone" (track 3 on the CD) to the tune of "Are You Sleeping?" Encourage children to follow the motions in parentheses.

Jesus welcomes, Jesus welcomes (Point up.) Everyone, everyone. (Make gathering motion.) He is here among us. (Nod and point to ground.) He is here among us. (Nod and point to ground.) Come and learn, come and learn. (Make gathering motion.) (Repeat 2x.)

Say: Jesus wants all of us to come to church because ► GOD HELPS US GROW. Let's sing a song about how good God is.

Lead children in singing "God Forgives" (track 4 on the CD) to the tune of "Ten Little Indians." Encourage children to follow the motions in parentheses.

God forgives us and always loves us. (Hug yourself.) God forgives us and always loves us. (Hug yourself.) God forgives us and always loves us. (Hug yourself.) The Bible tells me so. (Give the thumbs-up sign.) (Repeat.)

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After the children have sung it through, have them share some of the things that God does to care for them such as loving them, making good fruit grow on trees, or helping them grow. Then lead the children in thanking God for caring and helping them grow.

Say: Let's learn more about what Jesus said about how > GOD HELPS US GROW.



The Greatest Treasure

What You'll Do

Have the children form a circle and sit down. Open your Bible to Nehemiah 9:17, and show children the words. Use a small box as your "treasure box." Give each child a gold coin.

Say: God's given us a great treasure of his love and forgiveness. Our Key Verse from the Bible is Nehemiah 9:17, which says, "You are a forgiving God, gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love." This means that God forgives us and always loves us. Let's say that together. Lead the children in repeating this simplified version of the Key Verse with you: God forgives us and always loves us.

Have each child place his or her coin in the treasure box while saying the Key Verse.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- How is God's love like a treasure?
- Should we keep God's love in a box or give it away? Why?

Say: Jesus loves everyone. We can treasure God's love and forgiveness, and we can also give love and forgiveness to others!

What You'll Do

Say: Listen, everyone, Theo's coming! He has something to show us. Let's find out what it is. Play "Here, Theo" (track 2 on the CD), and bring out Theophilus the FaithRetriever.

Theo: Hi, everybody! Teacher: Hello, Theo! What's this on your paw? Theo: This is my hero-Uncle Rolf. I want to grow up to be just like him! Teacher: What do you like about Uncle Rolf? Theo: He's so smart and big and strong! Teacher: Well, today we'll be talking about how God helps us grow. Kids, can you show Theo how much you have grown? (Pause for children to jump up and show how big they are.) So, Theo, God will help you grow from a cute puppy into a big, strong, full-grown dog-maybe even like Uncle Rolf! And growing up is good! Theo: I'm glad God helps us grow! Teacher: Why don't you help us with our cheer. We'll say, "Praise God! ► GOD HELPS US GROW!" Are you ready, children? Are you ready, Theo? Then let's thank God! (Lead Theo and children in cheering "Praise God! God helps us grow!" three times.) Theo: I'm going to put this picture up on my wall to help me remember that God will help me grow up to be big and strong. 'Bye, everyone! Teacher: Let's say goodbye to Theo.

Encourage the children to wave or say goodbye to Theo. Then put Theo away in a safe place for next week's use.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What did Theo have in his paws?
- What did Theo learn about growing up?

Say: Let's see what the Bible tells us about how SOD HELPS US GROW.



Bible Time: Growing God's Way

What You'll Do

Open your Bible to Luke 6:43-45, and show the children the words.

Say: Today's Bible story tells us that ► GOD HELPS US GROW. In fact, when we look at the world around us, we can see many things that God causes to grow. Show the children the bowl of fruit.

Ask:

Where does fruit come from?

Cut each piece of fruit in half, and allow the children to dig out and examine the seeds in each piece of fruit.

Say: God created fruit. Inside fruit there are seeds. If you were to plant the seeds in dirt and keep the seeds watered, you could grow more fruit. God created the fruit seeds, and God helps the seeds grow.

Ask:

If you planted an apple seed, do you think you'd get a lollipop tree?

Say: No, if you planted apple seeds, you'd get an apple tree.

Ask:

If you planted an orange seed, do you think you'd get a giraffe tree?

Say: No, if you planted orange seeds, you'd get an orange tree. God created apple seeds to grow apples. God created orange seeds to grow oranges. God created the fruit. God created the seeds inside the fruit, and God makes the fruit grow.

Show kids the "Fruit Trees" pictures you cut apart before class. Have the children sort the fruit in the bowl to go with the proper tree.

Say: The Bible tells us each tree grows its own kind of fruit. And we know God helps the trees grow fruit. ► GOD HELPS US GROW, too.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- When you grow up, do you think you'll be an elephant or a person?
- When you grow up, do you think you'll be an apple tree or a person?

Say: When you grow up, you'll be a grown-up person. If you're a little boy, you'll grow up to be a man. If you're a little girl, you'll grow up to be a woman. God created us, and we're good creations! And ► GOD HELPS US GROW to be just what he wants us to be.

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4 WEAVING FAITH INTO LIFE

Choose at least two of the learning centers to help reinforce today's Bible lesson. Gather the needed materials, and put the supplies in an out-of-sight area until you're ready for them. Allow the children to choose which center they'd like to explore first. Then circulate among the children as they create and explore. Encourage them to make connections between their activities and the Bible by asking them the questions included with each center's description.

CENTER 1: Trees of a Kind

What You'll Do

Help the children place the fruit circle behind the tree on the My Bible Hugs page and push a paper fastener through the center. Have the children separate the prongs of the paper fastener and flatten them against the page. Then have the children make the fruit tree change by turning the circle so that the different fruits show through the windows.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What does God do to help the fruit grow?
- What does fruit need to grow?

Say: God sends rain and sunlight to help fruit trees grow. ► GOD HELPS US GROW, too. When we eat healthy fruit, we'll grow big and strong. God helps us grow by providing healthy food for us to eat.

Fruit Tree Snacks

What You'll Do

Have children clean their hands and then sit down to prepare their snack. Give each child a paper towel, a large round cookie, and a large pretzel rod. Have children each arrange the cookie and the pretzel to look like a tree. Have the children squeeze icing onto their cookies. Then have the children scatter fruit on their "trees."

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What would it be like if God didn't help fruits and vegetables grow? What would we eat?
- What would it be like if God didn't help us grow and we stayed little our whole lives?

Say: I'm thankful that God makes fruits grow because they taste so good. And I'm thankful that God helps us grow bigger and stronger and he helps our light shine brighter. Let's thank God for helping fruit trees grow, for helping us grow, and for providing our snack. Invite one child to pray. Provide cups of water with the snack.

CENTER 3:

Babies and Grown-Ups

What You'll Do

Have the children look at the pictures you've cut out. Then discuss with the children what each animal was when it was a baby. For example, a dog was a puppy and a cat was a kitten.


Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- What do kittens [puppies, babies, calves, colts] grow up to be?
- What will you be when you grow up?

Say: God created us all to grow—to get bigger and stronger until we're all grown up. ► GOD HELPS US GROW. God is good!

CENTER 4: Fluffy Trees

What You'll Do

Give each child a small handful of modeling dough and a small branch. Show them how to stick the branch in the dough, using the dough as a base, so it stands up like a tree. Then have children put a dot of glue on a pompom and stick it to the branch. Let kids put lots of pompoms on the branches.

Talk With Kids

Lead children in this discussion.

Ask:

- Who makes the trees grow taller and have fruit?
- Who makes you grow taller?
- What kinds of things will you be able to do when you are big?

Say: ► GOD HELPS US GROW bigger. He has wonderful things for us to do when we get big.

Daily Challenges

What You'll Do

After the children have cleaned up their centers, bring everyone back to a circle area on the floor. Review the lesson activities and the Bible Point, and then encourage the children to share what they remember about what they learned from the Bible today.

Also use this time to challenge kids in their faith. Encourage them to choose a Daily Challenge for applying today's lesson to their lives this week. Use this challenge for encouraging your children's growing relationships with Jesus.

Talk With Kids

Say: Today we learned that ► GOD HELPS US GROW. I would like each of you to choose a way to remember that God helps you grow this week.

Give kids these two challenges to choose from:

Before you turn off your light and go to bed, ask God to help you grow each day.

Spring Quarter Lesson 1 Preschool/Ages 3 & 4



Ask a parent to pray with you. Curl up in a ball and ask God to help you grow. When you've finished praying, stand up slowly and stretch while thanking God for helping you grow closer to him.

Say: If you want to pray after the light is off, circle the choice with one dot. If you want to curl up in a ball, circle the choice with two dots. Check that each child circled a choice on his or her My Bible Hugs page. Make sure you tell kids the challenge you choose. Your commitment will inspire children and will give them an opportunity to see God at work in your life as well as in theirs!

Action Prayer

What You'll Do

Form a circle, and have the children sit down.

Have the children curl into small balls and then slowly unfold into tall preschoolers standing on their tiptoes with arms stretched high. Then have the children pray:

Dear God,

Thank you for helping me grow. In Jesus' name, amen.
