Worship Session 1

Jesus Saves Us

Bible Story: Prophets Foretell Jesus' Coming (Jeremiah 33:14-16).

Worship Theme: God promised to send a Savior.

PREPARATION: Tape or tie a small flashlight to Theo's paws.

- **Leader:** Good morning, Theo. That's a pretty neat flashlight you have there.
- **Theo:** (Annoyed) It's not a flashlight. It's the Super- Duper Pup Emergency Beacon!
- Leader: Are you trying to signal Super Pup?
- Theo: (Depressed) Yeah, but it's not working.
- Leader: How long have you been trying?
- **Theo:** Since Friday! Maybe it's not bright enough for him to see it.
- Leader: Why do you need to signal Super Pup?
- Theo: (Very dramatically) Because I need him to rescue me!
- Leader: Rescue you? What do you need to be rescued from?
- Theo: (Embarrassed) Promise you won't laugh?
- Leader: Of course not!
- Theo: I got to have someone save me from math!
- Leader: Math?
- **Theo:** Yeah! Oh, it's really hard. All those numbers! I run out of toes to count on!
- Leader: So you're signaling Super Pup?
- **Theo:** (Imitating a TV-announcer voice) Super Pup always comes to the rescue of the weak and the helpless. (Sounding proud of himself) I'm going to have him do my math homework for me.

Leader: I don't think that's going to work.

Theo: (Horrified) You mean Super Pup can't do math either?

- **Leader:** What I mean is that you can't rely on Super Pup to do things for you.
- **Theo:** But the man on TV says to call on him whenever there's trouble.

Leader: That's pretend, Theo. For fun.

Theo: (*Crushed*) But I really believed it! Why did the man on TV say Super Pup would come if he won't?

Leader: It's just part of the story.

- **Theo:** (*Dramatically*) Then there's nobody to save me! We're all doomed!
- Leader: Actually, there is somebody, Theo.
- Theo: (Perking up) Really? Who?
- Leader: Jesus. He came to save the world.
- Theo: Wowser! But how do we know?
- Leader: Because God promised that he would send Jesus.
- **Theo:** I guess you can trust God a whole lot more than the guy on TV, huh?

Leader: Definitely.

- **Theo:** That's great! Do you think Jesus would do my math homework for me?
- **Leader:** No, I think Jesus would want you to learn to do it all by yourself.
