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How It Works



Simple Volunteer Roles

You'll need the following volunteers:

Leader: (That's you!) The one person in each teaching space who has looked over the lesson and will direct all activities. The glance-able, structured lessons in this guide allow leaders to spend more time interacting with kids and less time glued to scripts.

Crew Guide: A helper who simply shows up and participates with kids. Crew Guides don't need to be Bible experts—simply people who love Jesus and kids!

A Simple, Flexible Lesson!

Simple Prep for Leaders

Prepare your heart and pray for the kids before each lesson. Plus, check off supplies as you gather them!



Opening Options

Choose from two opening activities—both introduce the day's Bible Point. Each unit creatively uses the same supplies all four weeks. That means you'll need to gather Opening Options supplies only once a month! If you'd like, set up these Opening Options as activity stations in your room. Simply cut apart the cards you'll find in each lesson and place one at each station to guide activity and conversation. Or do one or both activities with all kids together. You choose!



Sing & Play

Gather kids to sing and discover the Bible Point. Plus, a Bible Memory Buddy connects the Bible verse to kids' everyday lives.



Bible Discovery

We've given you lots of options, but don't skip this part! It's the "meat" of the lesson where kids experience God's greatest gift in an interactive, hands-on way. There's no time to be bored as kids and Connect Crews follow the Leader through a memorable Bible experience. You'll read directly from the Bible throughout the Bible Discovery, so be sure to mark your place ahead of time and choose a kid-friendly translation to read from. We've intentionally chosen shorter passages for young attention s





Apply-It Options

Consider your time frame, and take your pick: a game, a snack, or a Coloring Creation page! Each option applies the Bible Point to everyday kid life, making faith relevant to even young kids.



Goodbye Circle

Wrap up your lesson with a gospel-centered Jesus connection, and remind kids that Jesus is with them wherever they go! Plus, affirm kids by name as you give each child a Bible Memory Buddy sticker at the end of each lesson.



A Simple, Flexible Format!

Age-Graded Classrooms

It's simple! You'll need one prepared leader and at least one helper (we call helpers Crew Guides) for each teaching space. We recommend having a media player handy in each space for music and each week's Bible Memory Buddy video.



Age-Graded Classrooms With a Multi-Age Opening

It's simple! Lead the Sing & Play section with all ages together. Set up a media player in your gathering area so that when you're all together, you can sing along with music videos, introduce the Bible Point, and meet the Bible Memory Buddy! Then, disperse to age-graded classrooms for Bible Discovery, Apply-It Options, and the Goodbye Circle. You'll need one prepared leader and at least one helper (we call helpers Crew Guides) for each teaching space.



One (big or small) Room With Multi-Age Kids

It's simple! You'll need one prepared leader plus at least one helper (we call helpers Crew Guides). Ideally, you'll have one Crew Guide for every five to eight kids, but it can work with your church's volunteer-to-children ratios. We recommend having a media player handy for music and each week's Bible Memory Buddy video.

Our Strategic Approach

And Bible Memory Buddies help discoveries stick! (wink, wink)

And it combines the repetition of a Bible Point with an auditory and physical response that will stick with kids long after your lesson ends.

With Simply Loved, a palette of Bible Point-supporting options gives you the freedom to choose what works for your kids and your time frame. So no matter how much of the lesson you complete, the Truth from God's Word shines through.
"Kids'll get bored if you repeat something they've heard before."	Kids appreciate routine and repetition when it's done in a fun way.	Simply Loved's scope and sequence intentionally repeats the Bible verse and Point for four weeks. This strategically cements Bible learning no matter how often kids attend.

A Faith Foundation for Young Children

As their leader, you get to show young children what loving Jesus looks like! And Simply Loved will help. Simply Loved incorporates these Age-Level Building Blocks to create a wonderful foundation for young children to learn to love and follow Jesus.

Young children are active! They like to move and use their whole bodies to make discoveries, so Simply Loved lessons engage young kids in a variety of active, hands-on ways.

Young children have short attention spans. Simply Loved lessons are broken down into bite-size pieces. Be sure to use the Simply Loved classroom songs to help young kids move from one thing to the next.

Young children feel so many things! Anger, frustration, love, comfort, fear. When you're sharing a Bible story, Simply Loved identifies a key emotion in the story and pauses to ask young children about a time they felt that way. Connecting to emotion cements learning and helps young children know that Jesus understands their feelings and is with them, no matter what.

Jesus often used tangible examples to make abstract learning more concrete. So Simply Loved uses everyday preschool items like blocks, backpacks, dolls, and trains!

It's young children's job to play! So Simply Loved incorporates imagination and play into Bible teaching.

Young children learn through repetition, so Simply Loved repeats, repeats, repeats. Each Simply Loved Pre-K & K lesson is centered around one easy-to-remember Bible Point that's said over and over. Repetition helps cement Bible truths into young minds and hearts to help them—not just someday, but right now!

Keep it simple. Young children need to know basic truths about God, so keep it simple! Simply Loved keeps memory verses simple and easy to understand, crafts simple so little hands can handle them, and games simple so kids can jump right in and play. We've left snacks up to you, so keep snacks simple and be mindful of allergies.

Young children thrive when they know what to expect. So Simply Loved establishes a predictable classroom routine young children can rely on.

Young children are busy explorers! Sometimes their curiosity can lead to unexpected emergencies. Be sure to supervise your little friends as they work with small objects to prevent choking hazards. And always double check for allergies before serving food. Most times, Simply Loved leaves snack choices up to you; however, if food supplies are listed, note this allergy alert to remind you to use caution when serving your young friends.

Jesus Teaches Through Parables

Matthew 7:15-29

Bible Point

Jesus knows what's best for us.

Purpose

Who's a "rock" in your life? What makes that person such a place of safety and security? Cherished friends or family members offer safe, solid footing when life is unstable. These anchors give you a firm place to land—no matter what!

Jesus offers the rock-solid foundation of his wisdom and love. In life's storms, Jesus' truth stands firm. Perhaps that's why he taught about the importance of not only *hearing* his words but also putting them into practice. Even when stormy times come, a life built on friendship with Jesus is immovable.

Little ones need stability and security, too. It's likely *you* may be *their* rock! Today guide them to discover that their lives can be safely cemented in the bedrock of their friendship with Jesus.



Prayer

Dear God, life is stormy sometimes. I'm battered by winds of worry. Fear falls like rain. Thank you that *your* love and wisdom give a firm place for me to stand. Thank you for holding me up and keeping me strong. In Jesus' name, amen.

Opening Options

Set up one—or both—of these intro activities to start your time together. Each activity connects kids to the Bible Point and to each other. Cut apart these Option Cards, and place one by each activity you choose. Crew Guides will follow the directions and build friendships with kids as they make discoveries together.





Vehicle Voting

Supplies: toy cars, trucks, and tractors

Choose which vehicle would be best for these things:



Which would be best for helping with a fire? Which would be best for driving in a race? Which would be best for working on a farm?

Add your own questions based on the toys available. Drive the toy around as you talk about why it would be the best one for that job. Talk about why certain vehicles would *not* be best for some jobs, too!

We're not cars or trucks, but there are things that are best for *us* to do, too! Sometimes we need help knowing what's best to do...or not to do. Today we'll see why it's best to follow Jesus because Jesus knows what's best for us.

What things make a building super strong?

Colorful Collapsing Cards

Supplies: index cards, washable markers, clear tape

Decorate index cards with lots of fun colors. Fold some cards in half. Stack the colorful cards into a

tower. How high can it go? Blow on the tower and

watch it tumble down! Build the tower again, but

this time use tape to make it stronger.

Today we'll hear a story Jesus told. He talked about making a strong house. Jesus told the story to help people know how to have the best, strongest *life*. It's good to follow Jesus' directions because Jesus knows what's best for us.

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Opening

Now's a great time for Opening Options. Choose one—or both—to introduce today's Bible discoveries.



"The Cleanup Song" (Music CD track 1)

Help kids transition by cleaning up before sitting with their Connect Crews. A Connect Crew is a smaller group of kids with one Crew Guide.



Sing & Play

Welcome

Hello, friends! I'm so glad you're here today. I just know we'll have the *best* time together. Let's start by singing our welcome song.



"Hello, My Friends" (Music CD track 2)

Let's say hello to our Crew Guides. They're our go-to friends who are here to have fun and learn along with us.

• Kids give their Crew Guides high-tens.

Bible Point

Today's Bible Point tells us **Jesus knows what's best for us.** When someone knows what's best for us, it means that person cares and wants good things for us. And guess what! Our friend **Jesus knows what's best for us.**

Every time you hear the words "Jesus knows what's best for us," point forward with one hand and say, "Follow him!" Let's try that together. Repeat the Point and response a few times.

Let's find out how Jesus knows what's best for us! (Follow him!) Watch and do what I do!

Lead everyone in the following song to the tune of "The Mulberry Bush."

Jesus knows what's best for you, (point to a friend)
Best for you, best for you! (point to a friend)
Jesus knows what's best for you, (point to a friend)
So let's follow him! (point forward)

Repeat several times.

Repetition cements learning, so be sure to say today's Bible Point A LOT. Have fun with it! Kids will love listening for it and responding, "Follow him!"

Jesus is such a good leader to follow. Let's tell Jesus we want to love and follow him with a song!





Bible Memory Buddy & Verse

It's time to talk to our friend Buzzly Bee. Buzzly will introduce us to a Bible Memory Buddy friend. Let's call for Buzzly. Do what I do!

- Flap hands quickly like a bee.
- Make buzzing sounds.



Chewy Bible Memory Buddy video (Week 1)

Chewy the beaver reminds us that Jesus knows what's best for us. (Follow him!)

- Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster.
- Remind everyone that beavers build cool homes right in the middle of water!
- Have everyone "hammer" their fists, as if they're building a cool home.


Show the Bible. The Bible is God's true story of love! Our Bible Memory Verse comes from the Bible. Let's say it together. I'll say a line, and then you repeat after me.

"Anyone who listens to my teaching (cup hand behind ear)
and follows it (march in place)
is wise, (touch head with index finger)
like a person who builds a house (alternate fists on top of each other as if building)
on solid rock." (firmly place fist on top of the other)
(Matthew 7:24)

The word wise sort of means being smart and knowing what's best to do. Hey, Jesus knows what's best for us! (Follow him!) We can trust Jesus to wisely take care of us, no matter what. Let's sing a song to celebrate! We'll shine Jesus' light!

Bible Discovery

Hold up a Bible. Today we'll look at a time in the Bible when Jesus told a story. Stories are fun, aren't they?

- Have everyone get comfy and sit in knee-to-knee circles with Connect Crews.
- **What's your favorite story or book?** Invite Crew Guides to share first.
- Crew Guides give thumbs-up when everyone has shared.

Lots of stories are just for fun. But sometimes a story can teach us or help us understand something. Jesus told stories to help people know more about God's love. Jesus also told stories to help people live like his good friends.

Jesus had been teaching people all kinds of good things about God. Then he told *this* story. Listen!



Read aloud Matthew 7:24.

Jesus said that following him was like building a house on a rock. Let's be houses built on a big, strong rock. Jump up and join me!

- Stand up and put your fingertips together over your head, like a roof.
- Have kids pretend their feet are "cemented" into a strong rock and can't move.
- **②** Hmmm. I wonder how strong your houses are.
- Walk around and gently push on a few kids' arms.

Jesus knows what's best for us! (Follow him!) When we follow Jesus, our lives are like houses that won't fall down. Keep being a strong house while you listen to what else Jesus said.



Read aloud Matthew 7:25.

You *seem* like pretty strong houses! But what if a storm came along? Can you still stand strong?

- Encourage kids to keep standing strong.
- Spray water over kids' heads, misting them a little.

Hooray! Jesus knows what's best for us! (Follow him!) You're like strong, sturdy houses because you follow Jesus. Let's celebrate that.

- Have everyone join hands to make a circle.
- Lead the following song to the tune of "Ring Around the Rosie."

Jesus knows the best way! (walk in a circle)
Jesus knows the best way! (walk in a circle)
Follow Jesus, (stop walking and point up)
Our lives stand strong! (stand with hands on hips)

Repeat averal times.

Supplies

- Bible
- "Jesus Teaches About Following Him" Bible Story poster
- spray bottle with water

We call helpers Crew Guides. If you lead a small class, you can be the Crew Guide. Simply gather kids in a cozy circle around you. If you have helpers, form smaller groups so each child can be known—and so kids can befriend your helpers, too!

Read the verses from the Bible.
You're showing kids that God's Word is special. And don't worry; we've kept the verses short for young attention spans.
