CREATION STATIONS



WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

You'll need for each child a flashlight, a balloon, a cup of dirt, and a snack.



FOR EXTRA IMPACT:

- Let kids each make a creation collage using craft supplies such as yarn, ribbon, buttons, fabric scraps, leaves, and stickers.
- Have kids form pairs and explain their collages.
- Teach kids the words to this prayer:

Thank you, God, for the world you made.

I will praise you every day.



Be aware that some children have food allergies that can be dangerous. Know your children, and consult with parents about allergies their children may have. Also be sure to read food labels carefully as hidden ingredients can cause allergy-related problems. **Kids celebrate God's creation.** Text: Genesis 1:1–2:2

DIRECTIONS

Designate seven stations. Place the following props, one for each child, at the stations: a flashlight (Station 1), a balloon (Station 2), a cup of dirt (Station 3), and a snack (Station 7). Have children leave the props at each station.

Station 1: In the beginning, God said, "Let there be light." (Turn off the lights, and turn on the flashlights.)

2: On the second day, God created the sky. (Inflate and release balloons.)

3: God made the seas and land. (Smell and touch the dirt in the cups.)

4: On the fourth day, God created the sun, moon, and stars. (Recite "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star.")

5: God made living things, including birds. ("Fly" around the room.)

6: God made people in his own image. (Shake each other's hand, and say, "Pleased to meet you.")

7: God rested and made the day holy. (Have kids enjoy a snack while resting.)

THE IMAGE



WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

You'll need a Bible and an instant-print camera and film.



FOR EXTRA IMPACT:

- Take pictures of each child, and put the photos on a bulletin board with this heading, "We are all created in God's image."
- Ask: What does it mean to be created in God's image? How can knowing that you're created in God's image change the way you act?
- Close in prayer, asking God to help kids grow more like Jesus every day.

Kids learn about respecting others. Text: Genesis 1:27

DIRECTIONS

Take one child aside ahead of time, and quietly explain that you'll take a picture of him or her and then destroy it.

Take a picture of the volunteer. As it develops, discuss how it's an image of the person. Admire the picture for a minute, then crush it, throw it on the ground, and step on it. Respond to the children's reactions.

Say: It's just an image. I didn't hurt the real person. Why would anyone be upset about what I did?

Read aloud **Genesis 1:27.** Say: People are created in God's image; it's like we're pictures of God.

Ask: Did I treat our friend's photo with respect and dignity? Why or why not? How do you think God feels when we don't treat people, who are made in his image, with respect? What kind of respectful words should we say to people who are created in God's image?

Say: You are created in God's image. Every day you are becoming more and more like him as you grow in Christ. Let's show respect for God by the way we treat each other.
