And you want to share all of that with kids in your community!



Before True North



Pray for everyone who will attend True North.

Ask God to prepare your heart and the hearts of the kids and leaders who will be part of VBS.



Work with the Preschool Director to select a room.

Choose a large, open room that can accommodate all your preschoolers at once.



Work with the VBS Director to collect necessary supplies.

Almost all the supplies are easy to find around the church, from church members, or from Group.



Determine the number of kids you'll have.

Most station activities will require a set of supplies for about every five kids.



Choose your Exploration Stations.

Each day features four options, including the Bible Activity Page. For a large group, duplicate stations or supplement these ideas with puzzles, a dress-up area, or a drawing station.

During True North



Keep it unstructured.

Preschoolers need time for unstructured discovery and a bit of free choice. Exploration Stations are an easy-prep way to ease little ones into a busy day of VBS so they get the *most* out of the time.



Keep it a free-choice time.

If children don't want to do the Bible Activity Page, don't force them. Just periodically invite preschoolers to join in the fun of doing things like painting and gluing tissue paper to the Bible picture.



Use an attention-getting signal.

Attention-getting signals let kids know when it's time to stop what they're doing and look at you. Use the Wilderness Whistle (available from group.com or your Group VBS supplier) or another signal of your choice.



Recycle station supplies.

Several days use the same supplies, such as chenille wires, pillows, blankets, toy food, and water play. But each day suggests a fresh, new way to use the supplies!



Repeat the daily Bible Point often.

Every activity focuses on one memorable Bible truth called the Bible Point. Repeating the Bible Point helps kids remember it and apply it to their lives after VBS. Each time kids hear the day's Bible Point, they'll pretend to pull a rope with both hands and finish the point by saying, "trust Jesus!"



Call on team members.

Ask a Station Leader, Station helper, or volunteer to "staff" each Exploration Station. (You may want to have the Craft & Play Leader guide kids in the Bible Activity Page each day.) Keep Crew Leaders free to roam to different stations, building special connections.



Play the Sing & Play Peak Music while kids create.

Music creates a fun atmosphere and, more important, reinforces faith!



Make the Bible connection.

Photocopy Exploration Station instructions; then tape them to the table or wall near the activity. This helps volunteers know exactly how to connect experiences to the Bible Point. Meet with staff before each day, and briefly walk them through each activity.

We can Trust Jesus!

When we wonder, we can trust Jesus.

Bible Verse: "Anyone who listens to my teaching and


follows it is wise." (Matthew 7:24)

Bible Story: John prepares the way and baptizes

Jesus. (Matthew 3; 11:1-6)

Jesus' cousin John came with unconventional clothes, a pauper's diet, and a bold message: "Repent, for the Kinadom of Heaven is near." Meaning? Jesus the Messiah and fulfillment of God's kingdom on earth—is here! John proclaimed Jesus' power and authority. He resisted the very idea of baptizing Jesus, the one who would baptize with fire and the Holy Spirit! While John adamantly proclaimed Christ, even he had questions about Jesus. From prison, John sent a message to Jesus, asking, "Are you the Messiah we've been expecting, or should we keep looking for someone else?" John's circumstances may have caused him to wonder if (and when) Jesus might take political action. Scholars ponder if John may have assumed the Messiah would be the one to rescue God's people from Roman rule—as many Jews of the time anticipated. However, Jesus had a greater mission than anyone could comprehend. He came to save the world from sin. Such love and compassion go beyond anything we can understand or imagine!

Kids' curiosity can be intimidating—and a bit wearying. They have so many questions, many of which we simply can't answer. And when it comes to questions about Jesus, God, or the Bible, adults can really feel overwhelmed and underprepared. But we don't have to have all the answers! Sometimes our wonderings can lead to true wonder, as we discover the mystery and marvel of God. Today, celebrate curiosity and questions. Point kids to Jesus, a trustworthy and true friend who will guide us as we seek to know and understand him better.

Bible Activity Page

Supplies: Day 1 Bible Activity Pages from Preschool Bible Pack* (1 per child) crayons glue sticks small squares of green and blue tissue paper finger paints *available from group.com or your Group VBS supplier

Give kids basic direction and ideas for adding color and texture to the page with the various craft supplies. Invite kids to wonder and use their imaginations to come up with other creative ways to use the supplies, and let them know they can ask you for more direction if needed.

- Today we'll hear a story from the Bible about a man named John. He taught people about God and told them God was sending an even greater teacher soon—the most important person God would ever send. It was an exciting message!
- ASK When have you heard something that got you excited?
- SAY Exciting news can get us wondering about when things will happen, and we might try to get ready for it. John helped people get ready for Jesus and know that when we wonder, we can... (trust Jesus!)

Be sure to write children's names on their pages. Set completed pages aside until Closing Circle, when kids will receive their pages and Day 1 Juneau stickers to take home. If kids don't choose the activity page during Exploration Stations, they'll still take one home.

Wonder Wall

Supplies:

tarp

pool noodles, in sets of 3 of the same color (if possible)

plastic funnels (1 per pool noodle)

painter's tape

shallow plastic bins (1 per pool noodle)

- water
- · small disposable cups

paper or hand towels



Before preschoolers arrive, lay a tarp on the floor up to the wall. Attach overlapping, winding pool noodles to the wall (as shown in photo) with painter's tape. Place the top of the pool noodles at preschoolers' height. Insert a funnel in the top of each pool noodle and a plastic bin to catch water at the bottom of each. Set a bin of water nearby along with cups and towels.

Pour small cups of water into the funnels. Wonder about and explore which bin the water will flow into—what direction will it follow? Listen for the water flowing through the pool noodles and try to guess.



What did you like about guessing where the water would go?



Wondering is fun! We got to look and listen for clues to follow the water's direction. When we wonder, we can... (trust Jesus!) and follow his directions.



The area we used for our field test had limited wall space, so we attached the pool noodles to foam core with zip ties and leaned it against a table. It was a great solution for the space and can work for you, too, if needed.

Before preschoolers arrive, prepare this imaginative campsite play area you'll use all week with the suggested supplies—or any you and your church community can lend. Alongside the campsite, tape parallel, winding lines a few feet apart to make a "river" path on the floor or lay Water Fabric on the floor to simulate a stream.

Use lots of imagination and play while exploring this fun campsite that brings the great outdoors, indoors.

ASK Tell about your favorite part of our Wild Life campsite—what exciting things did you do?

Was there anything you weren't sure what to do with?





River Crossing





Before preschoolers arrive, tape "steppingstone" felt pieces on the floor from one side of the Wild Life campsite's river to the other, spaced so preschoolers can step from stone to stone.

Step or hop along the steppingstones to get across the river.

ASK How did you choose which stone to step on next as you crossed the river?

You got to wonder as you decided which stones and steps to take to get across the river—another fun way to wonder! We wonder about "what's next" a lot, and when we wonder, we can... (trust Jesus!)
