And you want to share all of that with kids in your community!



Together, let's give kids a rock-solid foundation and point them to Jesus, their unmovable, unshakable friend forever.




Before True North



Pray for everyone who will attend True North.

Ask God to prepare your heart and the hearts of the kids and leaders who will be part of True North.



Determine the number of Crews you'll have.

Kids join mixed-age Crews—groups of up to five kids and one adult or teenage leader. You'll prepare a snack tray for each Crew.



Work with your Director to recruit a kitchen staff.

Your team helps prepare the food and snack trays, sets up tables for trays and water, makes quick trips to the store if you run short of anything, and cleans up after the snack rotation.



Identify where kids will eat.

Eating outdoors in a shaded area is best. Crews can spread out, and it's easier for Crew members to hear each other. You'll also need space for snack trays and cups and pitchers of water.



Work with the VBS Director to collect food and supplies.

You may ask for donations from church members or even local businesses.




Make a snack tray sign for each Crew.

At snack time, Crews just look for and grab the trays flagged with their numbers. This smooths the process of distributing snack trays and ensures that trays with allergymodified options get to the correct Crews.

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Set up a prep area.

If your church kitchen isn't large enough, set up tables where your team can work. Choose a spot that's close to the dining area, since you'll transport snack trays and water. Carts make it easy to move snacks and water from the prep area to the dining area.



Assign one team member to be the "allergy expert."

Assigning responsibility to one person helps ensure kids with food allergies receive the appropriate snack. Refer this person to the information on page 6.




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During True North



Get a count.

Each day, check with the registration team to find out if any snack number adjustments are needed because of walk-in registrations. Add extra for Crew Leaders, Station Leaders, and other staff.



Have Crews gather on blankets.

Washable blankets or disposable tablecloths keep Crews together for discussion while they're enjoying the snack. Plus, if you set out a blanket for every Crew, you'll know if everyone has arrived by seeing if all the blankets are taken!



Use an attention-getting signal.

Attention-getting signals let kids know when it's time to stop what they're doing and look at you. Use the Wilderness Whistle (available from group.com or your Group VBS supplier) or another signal of your choice.



Use a sound system.

Snack time gets noisy, so make sure everyone can hear you as you explain what to do, make announcements, and cue kids when it's time to clean up.



Play Sing & Play Peak Music while kids eat.

This adds fun and energy *and* helps kids learn these amazing, faith-building songs!

Items for Every Day:

- napkins (1 per person per day)
- disposable drinking cups (1 per person per day)



Wilderness Whistle* or another attention-getter



 non-latex disposable gloves (optional, roughly 5 pairs per kitchen staff member, plus some extra)



- water pitchers (1 for every 2 Crews)
- sturdy serving trays
 (1 per Crew)



- microphone and speaker
- washable blankets or disposable tablecloths (1 per Crew, optional)—for Crews to sit on during snack-eating time
- large trash cans and/or trash bags



- sticky notes and pens for marking snacks for kids with allergies
- Sing & Play Peak Music CD or download*

Rounding Up Supplies

You'll find a complete list of Tundra Treats supplies in the Master Supply List at group.com/vbsTools. It's likely you won't have to purchase everything from your VBS budget. Many congregation members are happy to donate money or food items. Just use the handy photocopiable snack donation request form, found on the True North Clip Art & Resources CD, to let them know how they can help. Check your church kitchen to see what serving supplies and paper goods are available for your use. See if you can borrow things like serving trays, pitchers, or food-preparation bowls if you don't have enough at your church.







Preparing Snack Trays

Each Crew's snacks are set out on a special snack tray, prepared by your team. A Crew consists of six people—five kids and one teenage or adult leader. Check with your VBS Director to see how many Crews you have at True North.

At snack time, guide Crews to select the snack tray that matches its name or number. A day or two ahead of True North, create your signs however you like or follow the easy, budget-friendly method we used below:

Supplies:

- plastic trays (1 per Crew for the week)
- small floral foam blocks (1 per Crew for the week)
- black wrapping paper or bulletin board paper
- transparent tape



- wooden skewers (1 per Crew for the week)
- Snack Tray Signs from the Clip Art & Resources CD* (1 per Crew for the week)
- wide-tipped, dark-colored marker
- duct tape

1. Wrap each floral foam block with black wrapping paper or bulletin board paper.




2. Push the pointed tip of a wooden skewer into each foam block.



3. Print copies of the Snack Tray Signs found on the Clip Art & Resources CD—one per Crew.



4. Using a wide-tipped, darkcolored marker, write the number of each Crew on a sign. Be sure to designate the difference between the elementary Crew numbers and the preschool Crew numbers. (We labeled preschool Crews with a P followed by the Crew number.)



5. Securely attach a Snack Tray Sign to each skewer with duct tape.



6. Use duct tape or another strong tape to adhere the foam block of each sign to the center of a snack tray for each Crew to have a designated snack tray.

Food Allergy Accommodations

- Each day, place your completed Allergy Alerts form in a prominent place where it's easy to read and reference.
- Place any alternative snack foods away from the other foods.
- Designate one or two people to prepare trays for Crews with food allergies for the week. This will provide a focused effort for no cross contamination of ingredients and potential allergens. Inform these volunteers each day of the alternative foods you're providing for kids with allergies.
- Attach a sticky note with the name of the child each altered snack belongs to, or place the snack in a resealable plastic bag and write the child's name directly on the bag.
- Carefully check ingredient lists, as some food is made in facilities that also process peanuts.


DAY 1

When we wonder, we can trust Jesus.

Bible Verse: "Anyone who listens to my teaching and follows it is wise." (Matthew 7:24)Bible Story: John prepares the way and baptizes Jesus. (Matthew 3; 11:1-6)

Jesus' cousin John came with unconventional clothes, a pauper's diet, and a bold message: "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is near." Meaning? Jesusthe Messiah and fulfillment of God's kingdom on earth—is here! John proclaimed Jesus' power and authority. He resisted the very idea of baptizing Jesus, the one who would baptize with fire and the Holy Spirit! While John adamantly proclaimed Christ, even he had questions about Jesus. From prison, John sent a message to Jesus, asking, "Are you the Messiah we've been expecting, or should we keep looking for someone else?" John's circumstances may have caused him to wonder if (and when) Jesus might take political action. Scholars ponder if John may have assumed the Messiah would be the one to rescue God's people from Roman rule—as many Jews of the time anticipated. However, Jesus had a greater mission than anyone could comprehend. He came to save the world from sin. Such love and compassion go beyond anything we can understand or imagine!

Kids' curiosity can be intimidating—and a bit wearying. They have so many questions, many of which we simply can't answer. And when it comes to questions about Jesus, God, or the Bible, adults can *really* feel overwhelmed and underprepared. But we don't have to have all the answers! Sometimes our wonderings can lead to true *wonder*, as we discover the mystery and marvel of God. Today, celebrate curiosity and questions. Point kids to Jesus, a trustworthy and true friend who will guide us as we seek to know and understand him better.



Pointing to Jesus

People (even John the Baptist) wondered about Jesus. This passage can encourage kids that it's okay to ask questions about Jesus—he will always help us find the truth.

Today's Snack Option 1: A (Northern) Light Snack



You'll need:

vanilla pudding cups (1 per person)

- blue, red, or purple drink mix (approximately 3 single-serve "sticks" per Crew)

- plastic spoons (1 per person)
- photocopies of the "A (Northern) Light Snack" snack cards on page 28 (1 per Crew)

COMPASS CLUE

Prepackaged snacks make your job a snap! Be sure to provide dairy-free pudding cups for kids who may need that option.



Today's Snack Option 2:


Blizzard in a Cup



You'll need:

puffcorn (1 snack bag per person)

• photocopies of the "Blizzard in a Cup" snack cards on page 28 (1 per Crew)





Before Kids Arrive

- Put enough snacks on a snack tray for each person to have one.
- Photocopy and cut apart the snack cards on page 28. Put one on each snack tray.
- Fill water cups and set them on tables in the snack-eating area.
- Fill water pitchers to refill water cups.
- Set up some tables to hold all elementary Crew snack trays and other tables to hold preschool Crew snack trays.

During Tundra Treats

- As Crews arrive for snack time, invite them to grab cups of water and then find a place to sit with their Crews.
- When all Crews have arrived, sound the Wilderness Whistle to get everyone's attention.
- Give a big welcome as Crews arrive for the first day at Tundra Treats. (You may want to explain that the *tundra* is sort of like a meadow where there aren't any trees. Tell kids that tundra is found where it's cold—like in Alaska! Introduce yourself and then explain the way snack time will work for the week.
- SAY Each day when you get to Tundra Treats, grab a cup of water while your Crew Leader finds and carries your Crew's snack tray. The trays are marked with Crew numbers so they're easy to find. Elementary Crews, your trays will always be here (point to where you'll place the elementary Crew trays throughout the week), and preschool Crews, your trays will always be here (point to where you'll place the preschool Crew trays throughout the week).

After you have your water and your tray, find a spot to sit. Elementary Crews, you can check out some of the fun activities on your daily schedules. Preschool friends, spend time getting to know the friends in your Crew! Our time at Tundra Treats will help you build friendships in your Crews.

- Have each Crew Leader quickly find and take his or her Crew's snack tray.
- Each Crew's Prayer Person will lead a prayer for the snack.
- Play the awesome Sing & Play Peak Music in the background while Crews enjoy the snack.

Finishing Up

- Ask Crews to throw away their trash.
- Dismiss Crews to their next stations.
- Enlist your team to pick up the Crew blankets, wipe up spills (if you're eating indoors), and straighten up the kitchen and snack area.

Pray and ask for God's blessing on the food you just prepared.



COMPASS CLUE

Bring a copy of your Allergy Alerts list to your snackeating area to use as a reference in case there are any questions from Crew Leaders or kids regarding food allergies and any snack modifications.

COMPASS CLUE

Have pitchers of water on hand for your team to use in refilling water cups. Keep everyone hydrated!
